Gainesville, Fla., Nov 3. - Strong showings by Tennessee's Doug Brown, individually, and Alabama, collectively, paced the Southeasterm Conference meet. Brown, the defending champion, continued his unbeatern fall campaign by establishing an early lead and powering over the 5.0m layout in a quick 24:13. The strapping senior seems to gain strength every time out, and must be conside da prime candidate for NCAA honors.

Alabama, running as a complete team for the first time this fall, defeated the reigning NCAA champion Tennessee squad by placing four runners in the top ten.

Tennessee's Ron Addison outkicked Alabama's Mark Brown for runnerup laurels, 24:49 to 24:56.

# Tide outpoints Vols to win first SEC cross country title

GAINESVILLE, Fla.
The University of Alabama won its first Southeastern Conference cross country championship Saturday, placing four runners in the top 10 finishers to overcome a 1-2 sweep by reigning NCAA champion Tennessee Saturday.

Alabama runners accumulated 41 points, six ahead of the Volunteers, who have won seven of the last eight SEC championships.

THE UNIVERSITY of Kentucky was a distant third with 70 points, followed by the host University of Florida squad with 86 and Auburn's 112.

Doug Brown and Ron Addison swept the first two places for Tennessee in covering the five mile course in 24:13 and 24:49, respectively.

Alabama's Mark Brown, of Johnson City, Tenn., finished third in 24:56.

All three times broke the course record here.

Alabama coach John Mitchell didn't consider it an upset.

"We came down here to win," he said. "It was the culmination of a lot of hard work. We have been five years building to this."

Alabama's Robin Shipman, of Bedford, Ind., finished fifth, as Herb Gibson of McKeesport, Pa., sixth and Frank Bromberg of Birmingham ninth.

OTHER MEMBERS of the Alabama team were Steve Bolt of Huntsville, who finished 17th, an Ray Edgeworth of Birmingham, who finished 23rd, and Bob Starling, of Jacksonville, Fla., 47th.

Auburn's top finisher was Clayton Nichols, who finished 11th.

Alabama now goes to the NCAA regional meet next week at Greenville, S. C., in a bid to go to Seattle Nov. 19 for the NCAA championship meet.
