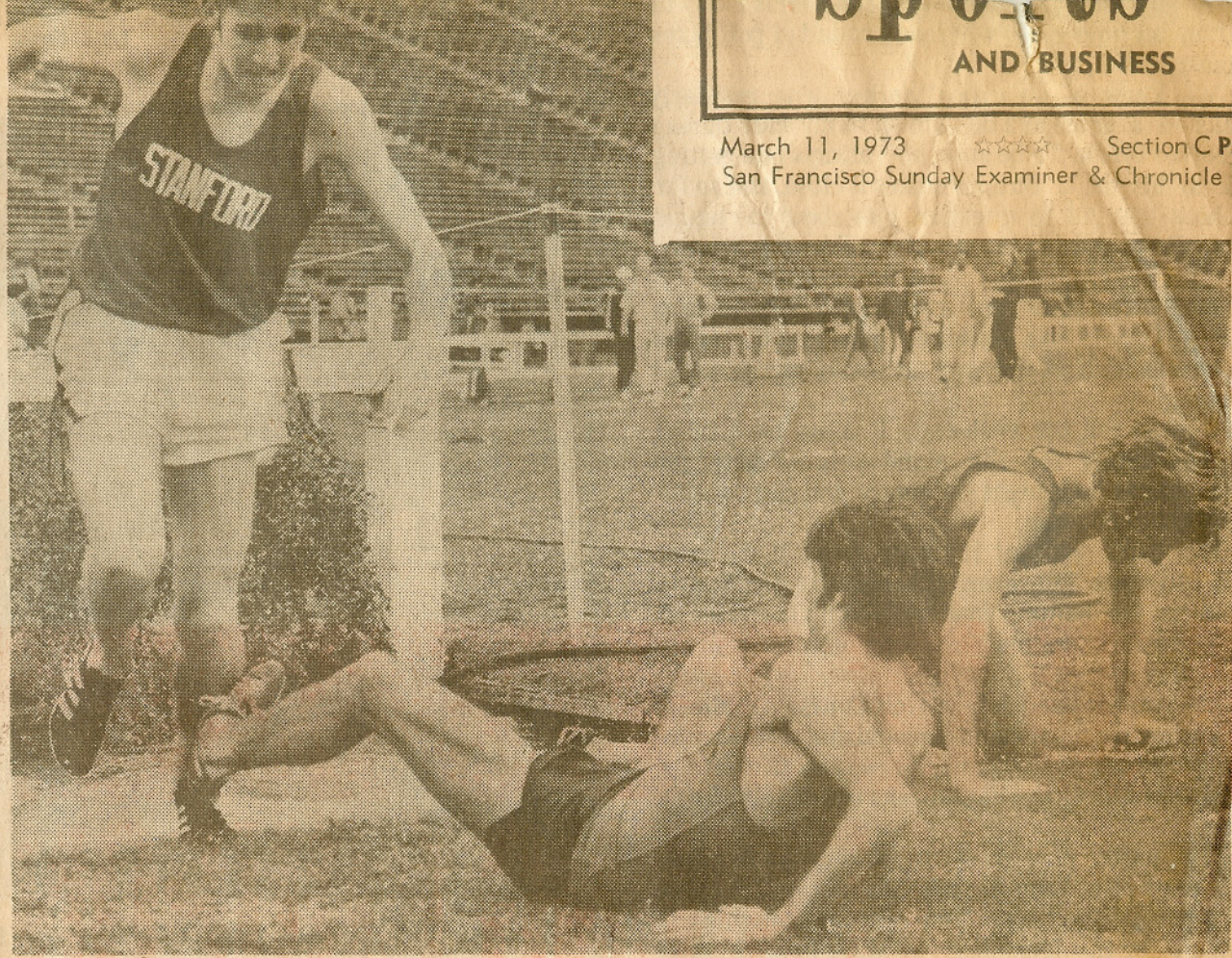


# A Spill and New Record

One of the more spectacular events in any track and field meet (at least when it's on the program) is the steeplechase. And this proved the case at Stanford yesterday during the annual dual meet with San Jose State. Above, Bob Schuchard of Stanford, Steve Peth of San Jose and Jeff Fishback of Stanford wound up in trouble over the water hurdle. Fishback fell first and Peth stumbled over him. As Peth rolled over on his back, his left leg tripped Schuchard (photo right, above) and he too went down. The race was won by Kurt Schoenrock of Stanford with his best ever time of 9:21.2. The day's record-breaking performance came in the shot put when sensational freshman Terry Albritton broke the Stanford mark with a winning distance of 61 feet, 5¼ inches.
