## Track Star In Pigtails Sets Mark

Mary Decker, a 95-pound, 15-year-old half-miler, helped chauvinistic fans forget victories by New Zealanders in the prestigiuos men's one and three mile runs last night at the Amateur Athletic Union indoor championships.

Miss Decker received written permission from her teachers in California to compete in the women's 880-yard run at Madison Square Garden. She has braces, a few acne pimples and wears pigtails.

She also set a meet record of 2 minutes 7.1 seconds. Last week she set the world indoor mark of 2:02.4. Last night she survived the experienced Abby Hoffman's closing rush. Miss Hoffman, of Toronto, drew even on the final turn, but was put away in the stretch.

The men's mile went to John Walker of New Zealand, competing in New York for the first time. He was a half-second faster than a North Dakotan, Michael Slack, in 4:01.6.

Walker's countryman, Dick Tayler, was a 60-yard winner over Frank Shorter of the Florida Track Club in a 13:08.6 three-mile.

Grant McLaren of Toronto was third in that race, but he may move higher in future meets. He missed a few months of practice after chasing the Lapland longspar in the Northwest Territories.

The Lapland longspar, of course, is a bird—and Mc-Laren had to catch 100 of them for laboratory work on his doctorate in zoology.

The long day at the Garden nominally is for the national championships. But many of the superstars of track were missing — either running for the pros, or their colleges and clubs somewhere else. Marty Liquori, the miler, was busy preparing the color commentary for a television track meet in Winnipeg, Manitoba, tonight.

Meanwhile, some of those who showed up were unhappy — especially in the men's long jump. Apparently, the gravel in the landing pit was left over from the rodeo. There were rocks in it.

During a warmup leap, the defending champion and the Olympic gold medalist, Randy Williams, stumbled over a rock and sprained his right ankle. He was out. Then Bouncey Moore, a former national champion, also hurt his ankle.

They missed a chance to compete in the Soviet Union next weekend. The top two American finishers in each event last night automatically won places on the United States team for the dual meet

One winner might be switching events soon. After capturing the 1,000-yard run, Rick Wohlhuter of Chicago decided that it was time to go at the mile full-time.

"I can't do anything more in the 880 or the 1,000 except lose," he explained.
"And if I lose at a mile, well, people will say it's not my distance anyway."

Earlier in the day, only about a thousand fans (compared to 12,225 a night) saw Joni Huntley high-jump 6 feet for the third time in a week.

Miss Huntley, a 17-year-old from Sheridan, Ore., is the only American woman to have leaped that high. "It drains me mentally and physically," she said after missing at 6-2. "I have to set my sights higher again. I was thinking of making 6 feet for two years, and now I probably have had a let-down."
