Cal State L.A.'s trackmen host a comparatively weak U.C. Santa Barbara team this Saturday at the Diablo oval.

Last Friday in Pomana was entirely another story.

Freshman Larry Rowles ran 9.4 in the 100 and 21.3 in the 220 on a warm windy day as the Diablos out dueled Cal Poly Pomana 82-72.

"There's no love lost between our two teams," said Assistant Coach Walt Williamson about the hotly contested, sometimes controversial meet."

"Our team did a great job under tough conditions," said Head Coach Ron Morris.

The Diablo distancemen outscored Pomana 23-4 to provide many needed points but it was the sprinters who came-up with the big performances.

Besides Rowles two big races Billy Derrick 14.4, Bill McCulloch 14.5 and Cappy Rillier 14.7 all ran lifetime bests in the high hurdles -- unfortunately all were windaided.

McCullough ran 53.7 to win the intermediates. The mile relay of Garcia Oden, Claudie Watson, Derrick and Jerome Ussery turned in a season best of 3:15.4.

Field event men David Benner 51-5 in the shot, Don Buss 15-0 in the vault and the Luke brothers in the javelin all got in on the winning act.

Bill Luke broke his own freshman record and moved to 5th on the all-time Diablo list with a mighty 206-5. Gene Luke grabbed second best with a lifetime best of 197.

Distanceman Sam Young won the 3-mile in 14:49.2 and Frank Britton took the mile with a 4:15.8.

The day after the Pomana meet hurdler Bill McCulloch traveled to the San Diego Invitational and set a new school record with a blazing 51.7 for the 440 intermediate hurdles.
