## Know Your Coaches

### OSU HEAD TRACK COACH BERNY WAGNER

Now in his 9th season as Oregon State head track coach is Berny Wagner, who came to the staff in 1965 on the heels of an outstanding prep and college career in California. Under his tutelage, the Beavers have swept seven individual NCAA championships. As a team, OSU had scored in the top 20 nationally five of six years and was in the top six three times. A total of 13 individuals have won 20 all-America honors. Among some of his better performers were athletes like Dick Fosbury, Willie Turner, Jim Barkley, Steve DeAutremont, Tom Woods and Hailu Ebba.

In dual meet competition under Wagner, the Beavers have won 44 and lost 21, experiencing only one losing season. OSU has won 17 of 29 dual meets in the tough Pacific-8 conference over the last six years.

Wagner coached 13 years in prep ranks at four California schools, following graduation from Stanford where he was a half-miler. He obtained his A.B. degree in 1948, and a year later his M.A. degree from Stanford. He moved to OSU after three years at College of San Mateo, where his teams won 29 of 31 dual meets and two conference championships. His first coaching job (1949-51) was at Wheatland, Cal., where he taught and coached all sports. He was basketball, cross country and track coach at Lodi for three years, and basketball and track coach at San Lorenzo for two years. In 1955, he became department head of Boy's P.E. at San Mateo high, also coaching track and cross-country. In 1962, he moved to College of San Mateo.

A native of Fresno, Cal., Wagner attended high school in Sacramento and Palo Alto before entering Stanford. His college career was interrupted when he joined the Navy V-12 program in 1942. He was discharged in 1946, after seeing action in the Pacific and Japanese theatres.

Wagner is a member of the athlete-oriented U. S. Olympic Track and Field Committee, is West Coast representative to the NCAA Track and Field Rules Committee, is a past member of the U. S. Cross Country Coaches Executive Committee and is a well-known lecturer. He was a featured speaker at the 1973 International Coaches Association in Madrid. He also was a visiting lecturer for the Mexican government in preparation for the 1968 Olympic Games.

**CHUCK McNEIL, Assistant Coach** — McNeil originally joined the OSU track staff in 1965, and returned a year ago after taking a year's leave. He had a Fulbright Professorship to the University of Dar es Salaam, in Tanzania, and also served as a sports specialist to Uganda and Ghana part of the time. He works mainly with Beaver sprinters, one of his best known proteges being Willie Turner, former NCAA 220 champion. McNeil is a 1959 graduate of San Jose State and received his master's degree in health and counseling and guidance from OSU in 1965. He served as assistant coach at Bakersfield college (1960-61) and was head coach at South high in Bakersfield (1962-64). A graduate of Turlock high in 1951, McNeil spent three years in the Navy, before entering Modesto JC and later San Jose State where he was a member of the world's fastest 880 relay team his senior year. In addition to track coaching duties, McNeil is an assistant professor of p.e. at OSU. Born 9-25-33.

**TIM VOLLMER, Assistant Coach** — 27 years old, a former state of Oregon high school discus throw champion from Benson High in Portland, Vollmer has returned to school after two years in the Army. He is the school record holder at 204'2", placed 8th at the Olympic

Games in 1972. He was the third best discus throw of all time at 221' 1", and is working out with an eye on the 1976 Olympics at Montreal. This past summer he toured with the U. S. National team winning the discus in the U.S.A. vs. Africa, and the U.S.A. vs. Russia meet. Ranked 3rd in U.S.A. and 8th in World in 1973.

**STEVE DeAUTREMONT, Assistant Coach** — a 1970 graduate of Oregon State, originally from Eugene, DeAutremont has settled in Corvallis to further his own training to help with the weight training programs of Oregon State field men. He has his eyes on the 1976 Olympic Games.

A former all state football and track star at St. Francis High of Eugene, DeAutremont is a two time NCAA hammer throw champion (1969 and 1970). He made the 1970 USA team which toured Europe and Russia, and also the 1973 team, becoming the first American to win an International hammer throw championship in a number of years, when he defeated the Italians. Ranked 3rd in U.S.A. in 1973.

**DENNIS PHILLIPS, Assistant Coach** — Works with the pole vaulters. OSU record holder, and former national junior college record holder while at College of San Mateo in California. Phillips was also the national indoor champion and record holder at 17' 3/4" in 1969. Now 27 years old, he graduated from OSU in 1970 after following Coach Wagner to Oregon State out of junior college. He is one of five OSU track men in the professional track circuit, and last year was one of the top pole vaulters on the circuit. Originally from Belmont, CA, Phillips has settled in the Corvallis area. His wife, Terri, is also an OSU grad.

**JOHN RADETICH, Assistant Coach** — Works with the high jumpers. Former Pacific-8 High Jump Champion from OSU, with a best of 7' 1" when he was a straddle jumper. Radetich changed to the flop while attending the U.S. Olympic Development camp in Durham, North Carolina in the summer of 1970 with Coach Wagner. He jumped 7' 2" indoors in the winter of 1971, then almost died with a ruptured appendix. It took him over a year to recover. He began jumping again and turned to the professional ranks so that he could have some competition. He immediately set a new World Indoor Record of 7' 4 3/4" and was the top professional high jumper on the pro circuit last year. He has studied all aspects of the flop style of high jumping and is probably the most knowledgeable jumper in the world at this time. Originally from San Carlos, California, he has settled in the Corvallis area, works out with the OSU jumpers as he coaches them.

**TED W. COX, Assistant Coach** — Works with the weight men. A 1969 graduate of LaVerne College in Southern California, was an active competitor during his high school and college career in the shot put, javelin and discus. From 1969-71, he taught physical education and coached as a Peace Corps volunteer in Sierra Leone, West Africa. During 1971-73 he was the National Track and Field Coach in Belize (British Honduras), Central America, where he conducted coaches' clinics, and organized track and field meets on various levels. Cox, 27, is presently doing graduate work in physical education at OSU.

**BOB BUELL, Assistant Coach** — In his second year at OSU. Buell graduated from Ashland High where he competed in cross country and track. He received his bachelor's and master's degrees from Lewis and Clark College in 1966 and 1970. At Lewis and Clark he lettered four years in cross country. In track he was second in the Northwest Conference two mile in 1964. He spent two years in the Army and won the 1968 US Army European cross country title. On returning from the service, he was cross country and assistant track

coach at Central Catholic High School for two years. He has now settled in Corvallis and is a permanent member of OSU's track coaching staff.

**ROBBIN ROEDER, Assistant Coach** — Works with the hammer throwers. Was number two on OSU's all time hammer list with a best of 163' 8" while at OSU. Roeder, 26, won the Canadian National title in 1971 with 191' 8" throw. He and his wife, Judy, have settled in Corvallis where he continues to work out and coach.

### JOSE AMAYA 5-7 129 Sophomore 20 Distances

**Prep Career:** A graduate of Wilson High in Los Angeles in 1972, Amaya had fifth fastest two mile time in the nation as a prep that year, 8:54.0. In 1971 he had fastest two and three mile marks in the country for prep Juniors. Senior year set a new Los Angeles City mile record, was second in the Golden West Invitational mile in the same time as the winner, and won the Chicago all-star Invitational Meet. His best time was 4:09.5. **College Career:** Has been the number one or number two man on the OSU cross country team in every meet for two years. Established a course record for Freshman on the OSU home cross country course, a record once held by Gerry Lindgren. He concentrated on speed and brought his mile time down to 4:04.4 during his Freshman year.

### YAW ATUAHENE 5-9 150 Junior 20 440

**Prep Career:** A September 1971 graduate of Adisadel High School in Cape Coast, Ghana. As a prep he clocked 9.8 in the 100 and 21.6 in the 220. Held school records in the 100, 220, 440, and also played field hockey and tennis. Was invited to be on the Ghanaian National Team in 1971, but did not participate because of a heavy academic load. **College Career:** As a Freshman he ran 9.9 and 22.5 with little preparation because of the red tape involved in getting to Oregon State from Ghana, and lack of time for workouts. Set an OSU Rook record of 47.6 during the winter term 1973. During the spring ran best 440 of 47.2. Anchored both the 440 and mile relay teams most of the season. Has run 49.2 indoors.

### DEVIN BROWN 6-2 165 Junior 21 Long Jump

**Prep Career:** Graduated from North Thurston High of Lacey, Washington in 1971. Placed in the Washington State High School Meet two years in the long jump and had a best of 22-10. Won the 1970 Seamount Decathlon Championships. Vaulted 14-0 his senior year. Held the Washington Prep Indoor Long Jump Record and was third in the National Junior Olympic Championships. **College Career:** Competed for Spokane Falls Community College in 1972 and 1973, in the long jump, triple jump, high jump and pole vault. Was co-captain of the squad in his sophomore year. Set SFCC long jump record at 24-4¾. Transferred to OSU in the fall of 1973.

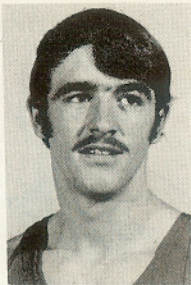
### RANDY BROWN 5-11 133 Sophomore 19 Distances

**Prep Career:** An outstanding student and athlete, Brown graduated from Sunset High in Beaverton in 1972 with a 3.33 GPA. He won the Oregon AAA cross country title in 1971, and the two mile championship in the State Track Meet in 1972 at 9:13.2. He also won titles in the Oregon AAU cross country meet and the Seaside Run High School Division. **College Career:** Won varsity letters in cross country as a freshman and a sophomore. Participated in the National Championships both years. Improved two mile time to 8:53.8, a rook record. Also set OSU rook records in the three mile at 13:46.8 and the six mile at 29:34.2. Has run the indoor three mile in 13:39.0 this past winter, knocking almost 20 seconds off present indoor three mile world record holder Tracy Smith's OSU indoor record.

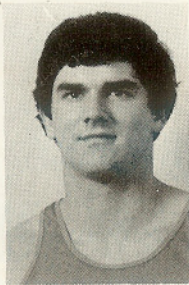

**STEVE CASEY 6-0 153 Senior 22 Intermediate Hurdles**

**Prep Career:** Came to OSU upon recommendation of Australian Olympic Hurdler Gary Knoke, after running 53.7 in high school. Attended Rostrevor College in Adelaide, South Australia where he won state championships in the high jump, intermediate hurdles, and high hurdles. **College Career:** Enrolled at OSU in 1970, but did not compete during first season because of a freak knee injury suffered in his dorm. Saw first varsity action as a sophomore scoring 25 points during the season. During his junior year took 5th in the Pacific-8 Conference Championships and 2nd in the Northern Division Meet.

**DOUG CRAMER 6-2 230 Senior Weights**

**Prep Career:** A 1970 graduate of Wilson High in Portland, he had a 61-5 best in the high school shot, and 159 in the discus. Also played basketball and football. Named Athlete of the Year at Wilson in 1970, his senior year. He was 4th and 2nd in Oregon AAA shot put championships in 1969 and 1970. **College Career:** As a freshman scored 21 team points and was a letter winner. In 1972, was 3rd best scorer on the team with 44 points. Last year, hampered by injuries, was 9th on the scoring list with 23 points. Cramer holds OSU's Rook hammer throw record of 167-8 and has a best of 179-10, the second best ever at OSU. Has a best in the shot of 58-5½, 6th best ever at OSU. He was the Northern Division hammer throw champion in 1972.

**STEVE DAIBER 5-7 139 Senior 21 Sprints**

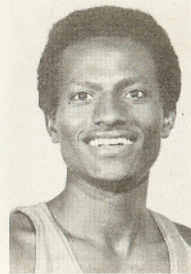
**Prep Career:** A 1970 grad of Centennial High in Portland, ran 9.7 and 21.8 during his Senior year. In his junior year was third in the 220 and fourth in the 100 in the AAA State Meet. A pulled hamstring forced him out of the Meet as a senior. **College Career:** Spent two seasons at Clark College in Vancouver, Washington and improved on his prep times, running 9.5 and 21.5 at Clark. Transferred to Oregon State as a Junior, and running on Bell Field's natural track achieved times of 9.5 and 21.8. OSU's new Chevron Urethane track should help Steve immensely.

**HAILU EBBA 5-9 145 Senior 23 Middle Distances**

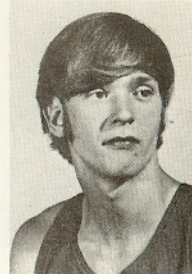
**Prep Career:** From Addis Alem, Ethiopia, Hailu graduated from Anderson High School in California as an American Field Service Exchange Student in 1970. His credentials in the mile as a prep were not outstanding, showing only a 4:32 best. However, 49.2 in the 440 indicated he had speed. **College Career:** Hailu made almost unbelievable progress his first year, improving to a 4:05.2 mile. A determined athlete, Hailu wanted to represent his country in the 1972 Olympics, and did so after a fine sophomore season. He won his first Olympic Trial heat in Munich in the 1500 meters, but did not place in the semi-finals, suffering stomach cramps. He holds the OSU rook record in the 880 at 1:49.7, and the mile record at 4:05.2. Currently his bests are 1:48.2 and 3:57.8. He has a best 1500 meters time of 3:40.4, sixth best collegiate time in the country in 1972. His mile time makes him the OSU record holder in the

mile, and his best two mile time of 8:40.6 gives him the Beaver record at that distance as well. He was ranked 15th in the USA at 800 meters in 1973, at 1:47.5, 16th in the world and 10th in the USA in the mile, and 18th in the USA in the two-mile last year. He is the 1972 and 1973 PAC-8 champion in the mile, and placed 4th in the NCAA Meet in 1973, earning his first all-American honors.

**MIKE FLEER 6-6 180 Junior 22 High Jump**

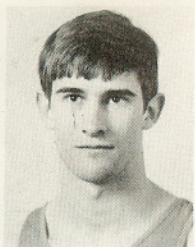
**Prep Career:** Graduated from McNary High of Salem in 1970 where he was an outstanding basketball player and track man. Lettered in basketball two years and was All-Valley League his senior year. Lettered in track three years and won the State AAA High Jump Championship his senior year at a State Record height of 6-9 as a straddle jumper. Also competed in the javelin and long jump. Was second in the Golden West Invitational his senior year. **College Career:** Switched to the flop and cleared 7-1½ in the summer after his Rook year. Ran into academic difficulties and was out of school for a year and a half. Last year, in his sophomore season of eligibility, he had a best official jump of 7-0 and an unofficial jump of 7-2¼ just one week before the NCAA Meet. He pulled a hamstring in practice before leaving for the National Championships and couldn't compete in Baton Rouge. This winter he has jumped 7-2 indoors, which ranks him as the No. 3 collegiate high jumper in the nation.

**CURT HEIDE 6-2 180 Sophomore 20 Javelin**

**Prep Career:** Graduated from Reynolds High of Troutdale, Oregon in 1972, played football for four years, although injured much of the time of Junior and Senior years. Was in track for four years and basketball for three years. A member of the National Honor Society, he graduated with a grade point average of 3.79. Was President of the Letterman's Club. His best throw in the javelin was 223-5. **College Career:** Improved to 248-5, breaking the OSU rook record held by Gary Stenlund, a former Olympian from Oregon State, set in 1959. He lettered as a Freshman and was ranked 20th in the USA and 15th on the collegiate list in his event for 1973.

**GEOFF HENDERSON 5-10 140 Senior 21 Middle Distances**

**Prep Career:** Graduated from George Washington High in San Francisco, California. Was in track and cross country for three years, and won league championships each year, the mile as a sophomore, the 880 as a junior and senior, and the cross country championship as a senior. He had a best half-mile time of 1:53.0 **College Career:** Entered Sacramento State College and ran there two years. Lettered in cross country as a freshman and in track as a freshman and sophomore. Ran bests of 1:52.2 and 4:13.6. Elected to transfer to Oregon State spring term 1973, and ran for the Staters Track Club. Had a mile time of 4:14.7 and a half-mile best of 1:56.2 last spring. This winter he had already run a 1:54.4 two-mile relay leg indoors.

**LEONARD HILL 5-11 138 Senior 21 Distances**

**Prep Career:** Graduated from Phoenix (Oregon) High in 1970. A two-time State AA two mile champion, he also placed second and first in the Class AA cross country meets in his Junior and Senior years. **College Career:** Had a fine freshman season and set Rook record in the six mile and steeplechase (8:55.4). The latter has developed into "his" event. Scored thirty-eight points as a sophomore, and was fifth in team scoring last year as a junior with 40 points. Has improved his steeplechase time to an OSU record of 8:43.0, breaking the former record set by Jim Barkley when he won the NCAA steeplechase in 1969. He is the defending PAC-8 Conference Steeplechase Champion, and has best times of 8:53.2 for the two mile, and 13:43.4 for the three mile. In 1973 he was the eighth fastest steeplechaser in the United States, quite an improvement from his prep bests of 4:28.1 and 9:30.4 for the one and two miles in high school. Elected co-captain of this year's team by his teammates.

**JIM JUDD 6-3 198 Senior 22 Javelin**

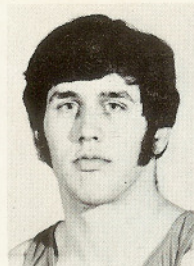
**Prep Career:** Graduated from Brookings-Harbor High School in 1970. Was president of the Academic Honor Society and lettered in both basketball and track. Ran the high hurdles and threw the javelin with a best mark in the latter event of 191 feet. **College Career:** Turned down a basketball scholarship at a smaller school to come to Oregon State to pursue a pre-medical major. Improved in the javelin to 210 feet as a freshman, 231 feet as a sophomore and 258 feet as a junior. His mark last year ranked him 12th in the United States, and 8th on the collegiate list. Won the Northern Division and Pacific-8 Conference Meets and was 7th in the NCAA Championships. Was tied for 5th in team scoring last year with 40 points. Has been admitted to Oregon Medical School.

**ED LIPSCOMB 6-2 170 Senior 23 Pole Vault**

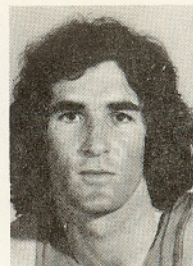
**Prep Career:** Graduate from Marshall High in Portland in 1969. Cleared 15' in high school. A broken arm kept him out of the state high school meet his senior year, but won his event at the National Junior Champ Meet that summer. **College Career:** As a freshman established a rook record of 15-6 outdoors and also did 16' indoors. Did not compete in 1971, and in 1972 competed for the Staters Track Club. Has topped 17-2 as a Stater and 117' in the Oregon State uniform. He is the defending Northern Division Meet Champion.

**JIM MILLER 6-4 240 Sophomore 20 Discus**

**Prep Career:** A 1972 graduate of Reynolds High in Troutdale, Miller was an outstanding High School football and track athlete. His best effort of 193-10 in the discus is the existing State High School record, and was the 4th best effort by a prep nationally in 1972. He won the State AAA discus title as a junior and a senior, played offensive and defensive tackle and was selected for the Shrine All Star Game after his senior year. **College Career:** Working under OSU record holder Tim Vollmer, he threw 20' farther than Tim did as a freshman, reaching 180-9, a rook record. He was the

top OSU discus thrower in his first year, and seventh in team scoring with 33 points. Qualified for the USA Junior Team which toured Germany, Poland and Russia this past summer, by taking second in the National Junior Champ Meet in Gainesville, Florida.

**WILSON MORRIS 6-1 178 Sophomore 21 Sprints**

**Prep Career:** Competed in football and track three years and basketball two years at Wilson High of Tacoma, Washington, from which he graduated in 1971. He ran a wind-aided 9.4 and 21.3 his junior years, and 9.4 with the wind and 21.2 his senior year. As a junior he earned thirds in the 100 and 220, in the Washington State High School Meet, and seconds in both events in the National Junior Olympics at Bowling Green, Ohio. His senior year he won the 100 and 220 and anchored his school's winning 880 yard relay team. **College Career:** Came to Oregon State on a football scholarship and has concentrated on that sport for two years. Started his track workouts in mid-January and has run in two indoor meets to date, clocking best of 6.2 for the 60 yard dash.

**JEFF OVESON 6-4 180 Senior 21 Intermediate Hurdles**

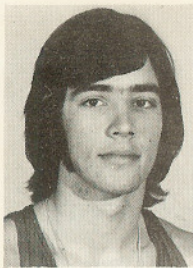
**Prep Career:** High point man in the 1970 Oregon A High School Meet his senior year. Won the high hurdles after taking the State A cross country title six months earlier. Also played on the Wallowa State Championship basketball team in 1970. His prep bests were 49.7 in the 440, 20.0 in the low hurdles, and 14.9 in the high hurdles. **College Career:** Ran 53.5 as a freshman in the intermediate hurdles, then improved to 52.4 as a sophomore and to 51.3 and the Pacific-8 Conference Championship as a junior. As a sophomore he was second in the Northern Division Meet and first as a junior. He was the team's fourth leading scorer with 42½ points last year after scoring 38½ as a sophomore. Elected co-captain of this year's team by his team mates.

**STEVE RIM 6-0 172 Sophomore 20 Triple Jump**

**Prep Career:** From Clovis, California, Rim was the top prep triple jumper in the country in 1972 with a best of 50-10 set at the Golden West Invitational. He also won the Chicago Invitational his senior year. Has done 24-7 in the long jump as well. Played two years of football and basketball at Covis. **College Career:** Injured much of his freshman season, he never-the-less set an OSU rook record of 48-5. He is now healthy and stronger, and has jumped well indoors this winter. Won the Seattle Indoor Invitational with a jump of 48-8.

**DARREL "Butch" SCHMIDT 6-6 280 Junior 22 Shot Put**

**Prep Career:** Graduated from Wahtonka High School, The Dalles, Oregon in 1970. Was vice president of the student body his senior year, All-State in track for three years, played football for three years, played basketball four years, was a member of the Academic Honor Society for three years. Was selected Wahtonka Athlete of the Year in 1970. Had best marks of 174-10 in the discus and set a State Shot Put Record of 62-5. **College Career:** Set a rook shot record of 57-2 in 1971. He red-shirted his sophomore year because

of Hepatitis contracted late in the summer while fighting fires in Central Oregon. Became a 60 footer in the Oregon Meet in 1973, and put over 60 feet in three consecutive meets, finally setting a new OSU Record of 61-8 in the Pacific-8 Conference Meet, taking third. He was 8th in team scoring with 33 points and ranked 13 in the USA in the shot put last year.

**DOUG SNYDE** 5-11 70 Senior 21 High Hurdles

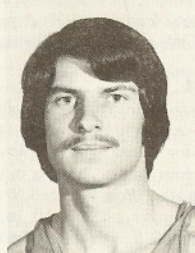
**Prep Career:** Graduated from Lodi High, Lodi, California in 1970. During his senior year was undefeated in dual meet competition over the high hurdles. Set a Conference record of 14.3 and finished sixth in the State Meet. His best marks were 14.2 in the high hurdles and 19.4 in the low hurdles. He was an all around track man, also competing in the long jump, triple jump, and mile relay. **College Career:** Has a best of 14.5 and a wind-aided 14.1. Has also done 53.4 in the intermediate hurdles. Has been hampered by injuries primarily because he is a little to short to be an outstanding hurdler on a natural track such as Bell Field. The synthetic surface of OSU's new track should help Doug realize his potential.

**TOM WOODS** 6-5 178 Junior 20 High Jump

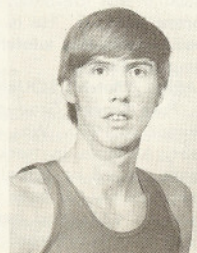
**Prep Career:** Oregon High Jump Champion and record holder at 6-11½. Also played basketball. Woods graduated from Estacada High in 1971, where he was named Athlete of the Year. Attended the Olympic Development Camp in Maine following graduation, jumping 7'. **College Career:** Achieved more in his first varsity season than most would in a career. Finished the season by taking the NCAA Championship and record at 7-3¼, the top mark in the U.S. in 1972 and the seventh best in the world. This past year (1973) he ranked first in the nation in collegiate circles with his OSU record of 7-4½. His mark broke Dick Fosbury's school record of 7-4¼, which is still the Olympic Games record. He ranked second in the USA and second in the world behind the world record holder this past year. In his sophomore year Woods was "only" second in the NCAA Meet, losing to Reynaldo Brown on fewer misses, but further improving upon his NCAA Meet record by jumping 7-4. He was second at the AAU Meet and made the USA team touring Russia and Europe this past summer.
