Girl, 17, sets 'secret' jump record

An American woman high jumped 6-0 for the first time in the Oakland Indoor Invitational track meet or at least that's what the 3289 fans were told last night when they arrived at the Coliseum Arena.

By the time the first event got off last night Joni Hutley had advanced her own indoor record to 6-0 1/2, been dressed and out of the arena for eight hours.

Because of what officials considered an already cramped evening program, the women's open high jump was moved back into the early morning along with the walking events and the delivery of equipment.

It was double disappointing since Miss Hutley's was the most significant of three American records set in the meet. Maren Seidler of San Jose improved her own shot put mark to 56-11 and Laney College sophomore James

Robinson lowered the 600 meter run record to 1:18.8 for the others.

"I guess there were about eight people here when I jumped," said Miss Hutley, "but it was like that when I jumped 5-10 at Portland for the old record, a couple of weeks ago."

A 17 year old senior at Sheridan (Ore.) High School, Joni has improved steadily in this, just her second season on the indoor tour. In three indoor meets she has improved each time from 5-10 up to yesterday's a.m. jump.

"I felt I was ready for something like this at Portland but after I broke the record there the adrenalin just kind of flowed out of me," Joni said. "I knew I could get 6-0 with a chance to compete . . . they didn't pay my expenses here but I figure if there was a high jump event I ought to come down."

Joni tried one jump at 6-1

1/2 but quit after she hit her head on the bar — she's an exponent of the Fosbury Flop.

For Miss Seidler it was the second time in as many weeks she's improved on her own record, an indication that her decision to move to San Jose and train full time is paying off.

Maren shyly predicted she might reach 57 feet before she even went out to compete and indicated she sees no reason why she shouldn't make it to the magic 60-foot barrier by the end of this season.

"I never would have thought of saying that in the past," Miss Seidler said. "But I've decided to devote my full efforts to improving in my event. The workouts with my roommate Linda Langford and with Al Feuerbach have helped me greatly. I've learned so much from Al, particularly about how much to use weight training."

Laney's Robinson broke Juris Luzins' two year old mark by overtaking international veteran Mark Winzenreid on the final turn and powering to the tape, a winner by five yards.

Robinson, who wears a warmup suit which has "I Paid The Cost. So Now I'm the Boss," in block letters on the back, proved he was the boss by beating Winzenreid at his own game. He was stronger coming to the tape.
