BOB COFFMAN (USC, 23, P.E. major, Sr.), First day leader in the Decathlon

"I would have been ahead by 57 more points if I had thrown the shot like I had been in practice. I was going around 48 in practice and I threw only 44-8 today. Yes, my first day is my best day, but I still have two good events on Saturday--the hurdles and the discus. My last events aren't too strong and I've never had anybody to run against in the 1500 meters, so I can't say how I will do in that event."

TODD LATHERS (Oregon, 21, Recreation major, Senior) -- winner of 3,000 meter steeplechase with time of 8:48.0-- I decided I wouldn't lead through the first four laps -- that's a tough way to run it. I thought Innes (Gordon, who got second) would go out fast, but he didn't. I knew the pace was a little slow, but I didn't want to go out fast since I'll probably run the mile, too. I had planned to take the lead with one lap or one-half lap to go (he made his move with about a lap left). The slow pace through most the race probably helped the other runners -- a faster early pace would have strung the field out."

JIM JUDD (OSU, 22, Pre-med major, Sr.) Javelin winner

"My second throw today was my best effort. The wind did have an effect on my throws. ~~xxxxxxx~~ I'm not a flat thrower. If I did throw it level the wind would help, but since I don't it actually hurts. My last throw was terrible--I've had trouble with my form.

"I think a throw of 265 will win the NCAAs this year. There aren't that many good javelin throwers in college this season. I was ready to throw that far today, but I didn't get my good form down."

TREVOR CAMPBELL (USC, 19, Public Relations major, soph) winner of 2nd heat, 440, 47.2

"I was sluggish in the first 30 yards, but then I got off. But I was tight all the way. I wanted to run the first 100 yards in 10 seconds or better--that's been my problem all year, running the first 100 fast enough. In the finals, I think it'll go down into the 45's to win, but a lot will depend on the wind. I hope we won't be going into a head wind in the stretch."

MAXIE PARKS (UCLA, 22, Sociology major, 22 Sr.,) Winner of
440 Heat

"The right leg that I hurt against USC two weeks ago felt fine today fine today--no pain. I stayed off of it last week and that helped. It was sort of a cramp or mild strain. No, I don't feel any added pressure on myself because Benny (Brown) is out. The only pressure I usually feel is going to the wire against Benny. We are such competitors that even though we are on the same team, we both want to win badly. I respect the quarter milers from USC, but it's not like running against Benny--It's actually less pressure with him out. I think the final will be fast. I'd like to run in the 45's, but I don't know if my leg could handle the pressure."

JAMES BAXTER (USC, 21, Electrical Engineering major, Sr.)
Winner of 880 heat

"I went out fast today and didn't follow anybody like I had in previous races. I ran my best 660 in awhile. I was also testing my endurance and I'm running better. Getting out fast is best for me. (Rick) Brown and (Tony) Veney will be the guys I'll be looking at in the finals. I'll have to go out like I did today, maybe even faster. Last time I ran against those two I ran their race instead of my own and waited too long to get going."

RICK BROWN (Cal, 22, Senior, P.E. major) 2nd in 2nd heat of
880; has won Pac-8 880 title three straight years.

"I thought the heat went pretty good. I was going good toward the end, but then saw some shadows coming up on me and had to give it a little juice. The whole field in the final is good and it is tough to single anyone out as the toughest competition. They are all potentially dangerous."

TOM ANDREWS (USC, 19, P.E. major, Fr.) winner of 440 intermediate
hurdles Heat

"I think I can do better in the finals, maybe around 50.8. I don't know about winning the high hurdles (he qualified in that event also), but I think I can place there. My step is better in the intermediate hurdles because I've adjusted my step in practice. We've set the hurdles at a random distance apart so that I can get better vision of them before I get there and can adjust my step in the last 20 yards instead of the last 10."

RANDY WILLIAMS (USC, 20, Junior, P. E. major) -- winner of long jump with best of 25-6 $\frac{3}{4}$; third straight Pac-8 long jump title.

"This has been a tough year for me, until now, but I think it means next year will be a good one for me. I can't imagine two years in a row like this one. My back still bothers me, but the tendons in the back of my right thigh are sore, too, because of that. I can just touch my thigh and it hurts. As far as the acupuncture goes, the needles don't hurt while they're in, but it hurts a little when they put them in (he's been having acupuncture for his back).

MIKE SHAVERS x (USC, 19, P.E. major, 19, Fr.) winner of 100 Heat and second in 220 Heat

"In the 100 the wind did hurt the times. I didn't have a good start in that race, but I managed to survive it. Sometimes when that happens, you can't come back. In the 220, ~~is~~ I'm still learning to run the curves. I caught up midway through, but then I fell behind. I really don't like the 220 as much as the 100. People keep telling me I'm better in the 220, but I like that short stuff."

ED LIPSCOMB (Oregon State, 23, Liberal Studies major, Sr.)
winner of Pole Vault; 17-4 $\frac{1}{2}$, new OSU school record

"The wind hurt the vaulting today, but I felt pretty good. I was surprise (Francois) Tracanelli missed at 17-feet. I cleared 16-4 and then passed at 16-8 and made 17 on my first jump. I got the 17-4 $\frac{1}{2}$ on my second jump. My last attempt at 18-1 was my best, and the first half of it was good. I'm going to win the NCAA's--I'm as good as anybody else in it."

DAVE SCHILLER (UCLA, 21, Senior, Psychology major) winner of shot put with best of 61-10 $\frac{3}{4}$ (was second in '73)

"I was happy to win, but not happy with my distance. I wanted to win today, and will take a win with any distance. The conditions were good, but it was a long wait between throws; they didn't put us in flights, and with eight of us throwing, it's a long wait. I want to throw in some more meets before the NCAA. I took most of this week off, and I've been taking some other time off, so I'm a little rusty and I need the work. At the NCAA I just want to place and I'll be happy with anything, from first through sixth. But I figure I'll need a couple more feet, over 63 feet, to place in the NCAA."

DAVID THOMAS (USC, 21, P.E. major, M. Jr.) Anchored Winning 440-yard Relay team for USC

"I looked at the other handoffs and they were all good. I knew we were in the lead and I was just hoping we could get our handoff right. I knew that if we did get a smooth handoff, we had the race. I looked out of the corner of my eye and saw Sammy Burns (Cal) matching me stride for stride. That's the way it was up until the end and I just got him by a nose. We had excellent handoffs all the way. I've been injured, and this is the best I've run all year. This is only my third meet since the injury and I think I'm coming along."

CRAIG BRIGMAN (Oregon, 20, Soph., General Science major) -- winner of decathlon with total of 7,636 points (won in '73 with 7673 total)

"Before the year began I had hoped to be around 7800 points by the time we got to the Pac-8, but my injury set me back and I'm just happy to win. I missed seven weeks of work, and this is only my second decathlon this year. I was very confident about the pole vault and knew what I was doing the whole time. I wasn't concerned. I probably should have made 16-6, but I was lacking a little concentration on my plant. I was pleased with everything today except the hurdles. That doesn't mean I'm satisfied, but considering where I am in my training, I'm happy with how I'm doing."

HAILU EBBA (Ore. St. 23, Pre-med major, Sr.) winner of Mile Run

"I thought I could catch him (Oregon's Mark Feig) all along. I knew it would be a battle, but when we got to the last turn I knew I had him. The suspense for me was if the Oregon guys would go out fast or not. I'm not unhappy with my time today because I knew I had to run in the mile relay, so the time didn't really matter."

ED WASHINGTON (USC, leading 1200M, but fell off last hurdle) --

"I don't know what happened. I felt good and was making a move at the eighth hurdle. The next thing I knew I was on the track and I just tried to roll out of the way!"

MATT HOGSETT (Stanford, 19, Soph., History major) -- winner of
440 intermediate hurdles in 51.3

"This was my best time by far. I felt I could place, but never realistically thought I could win it. That may be bad for an athlete to say, but I really never thought about winning. Running with the wind in the home stretch really helped me a lot. I didn't think I was in too good of shape after 220, but then with two hurdles left I felt I had a chance. After the last hurdle I had the feeling it was mine. It was a quick race."

GARY MINOR (WSU, 19, Police ~~xxxx~~ Science major, So.) Winner
of the 220-yard ~~dash~~ Dash.

"The big thing for me was to come hard off the corner and get good arm lift. I came off the turn feeling good and going hard. I could see (USC's Mike) Shavers coming up at the end. I figured that if I ran a hard curve I ~~xxxxxx~~ could win it. I told my teammates that if I got lanes 5, 6, or 7 that I was going to win."

CLARENCE TAYLOR (UCLA, 22, Junior, Design major) -- winner of
triple jump with best of 53-4 3/4

"I twisted my knee a little a week ago at Fresno and was concerned about that. But it has responded well to treatment and has come back fast. I was able to jump with very little pain. I hit my winning jump on my fourth try, and took only one more jump after that, just to test the knee. I'll continue the treatment, but will go back to my regular workouts this week, too. I will probably compete at Modesto but will skip the Kennedy Games. I want to get a meet in before the NCAA, but don't want to compete too close to it."

MIKE FLEER (OSU, 22, Junior, Psychology major) -- winner of high
jump with best of 7-1 1/2.

"I was very surprised with the win, because of the way the day started for me. My steps were off, I was running too slow and I was taking off too far from the bar. But I get it corrected at 7 feet by moving my steps in. I usually use a 50-foot approach, but I had to move in to 47 feet. I will compete at Modesto and would go to the Kennedy Games if invited. At the NCAA all I want to do is win. I don't want to set my sights on any particular height--when you do that, you limit yourself."
