WALDROP RUNS 3:55 MILE FOR RECORD

SAN DIEGO—Tony Waldrop ran his fifth consecutive sub-4 minute mile, 3:55 flat, to set a world indoor record before 6,023 in the San Diego Indoor Games Sunday night.

Waldrop, University of North Carolina senior, broke the record of 3:56.4, first set 10 years ago by Tom O'Hara of Chicago and equaled in 1971 by Jim Ryn.

In the last race of the evening, Oregon's Steve Prefontaine broke his own American indoor two-mile record of 8:22.2 with a time of 8:20.4.

Francie Larrieu of Sunnyvale broke all global marks, indoors and out, for 3,000 meters and two miles. Miss Larrieu, 21, who will enter UCLA in April on a partial athletic scholarship, was timed in 9:39.4 for

two miles. She passed 3,000 meters, 240 yards short of the finish, in 9:02.4.

Miss Larrieu broke the indoor record for two miles of 10:12.0 by Tamara Pangelova of Russia in 1973. Francie held the outdoor record of 10:00.2 and had an unofficial 9:44.0 outdoors.

Tiny Mary Decker, 15, ran away with a world indoor best for 800 meters and 880 yards. Miss Decker ran the 880 in 2:02.4 to break her week old record of 2:06.7 set in the Times Indoor Games.

The Garden Grove High School sophomore was timed in 2:01.8 for 800 meters, seven yards short of the 880.

Waldrop, whose previous outdoor best was 3:57.3, followed the pace of the Pacific Coast Club's Larry Rose. Waldrop passed the 440 in 59.0, the 880 in 1:59.0 and the 1,320 in 2:59.0. He took the lead shortly before the three-quarters mark and was on his own. He finished with a 56.0 last 440.

"Larry Rose did most of the work setting the pace. It wasn't pre-arranged," Waldrop said. "I felt strong after three-quarters and decided to go and see what I could do." He said it was the biggest race of his life but it wouldn't be the big news at North Carolina. The school's basketball team would command the headlines.

"That's the way I like it. I just want to be thought of as another student."

In the two mile, Prefontaine waged a head-to-head duel with New Zealand's Dick Taylor that forced the fast pace. Prefontaine took the lead

with 300 yards to go and sprinted away from the Kiwi runner who ran 8:22.4
