

Army Leads Service Meet

The Army, capturing six of ten events, yesterday vaulted into the lead of the 1975 Interservice Track and Field Championships at Laney College in Oakland.

Two interservice records were set by Marines—in the high jump and the 5000 meters—during opening day competition which saw the Army register 48 points, the Marines 30, the Air Force 9 and the Navy 3. The meet will wind up this afternoon beginning at 3:15.

Robert Wallis of the Army led the way in the javelin with a flip of 251-3 feet, not bad for a guy with a broken rib, which Wallis has. He suffered the injury at Eu-

gene, Ore., a week ago.

Randy Turner of the Marines cleared the bar at 7-0 feet in the high jump to better the old record by one inch. His teammate, Phil Meyer, won the 5000 meter run in 14:08, clipping more than six seconds off the previous standard.

In the day's closest race, Marines Skip Kent and Willie Mason were both timed in 1:51.6 in the 800 meters, with the nod going to Kent.

The Army's Tom Hill, bronze medalist in the 1972 Olympics, captured the 110 meter high hurdles in 13'6.

Today's competition will be highlighted by the triple jump, featuring 1974 NCAA

indoor champion Tommy Haynes against Army teammates Rayfield Dupree and Barry McClure.
