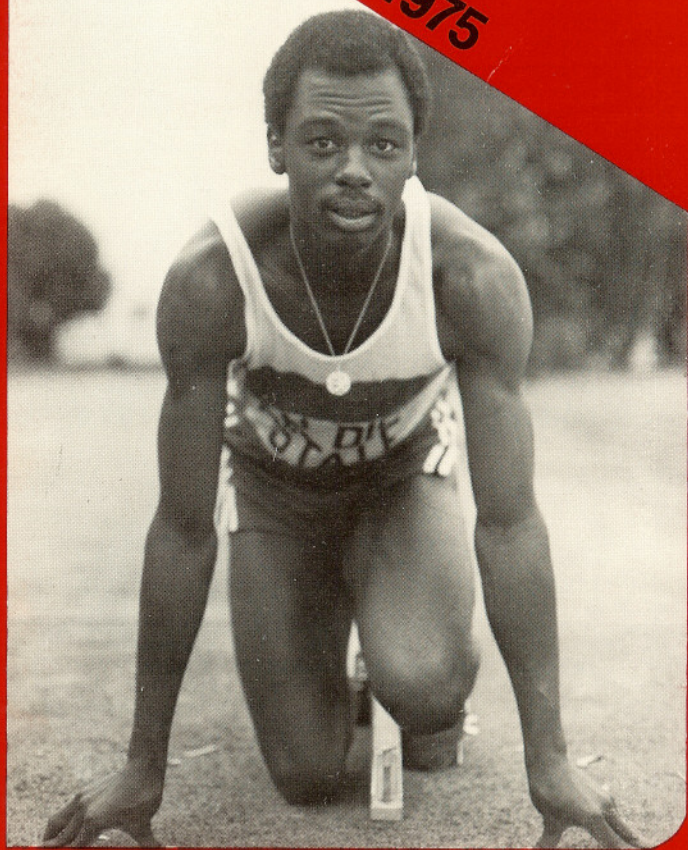

## COACHING STAFF



**DICK HILL**  
Aztec Head Coach

In his third year as head track coach for San Diego State University, Dick Hill has brought to the Aztecs his background of professional success, including coaching athletes to 30 world records and three individual Olympic gold medals.

Hill came to San Diego State in 1973 from Southern University, where he had coached from 1965 to 1969 and in 1971 and 1972. A 1960 alumnus of the school, with a B.S. in physical education, his teams there won five NAIA national titles in three years, and Hill was named National Track Coach of the Year.

Southern won NAIA championships outdoors in 1966, 1967, and 1968, as well as the 1966 and 1967 indoor titles. After a year's leave of absence in 1970 to complete his Ed.D. (doctoral) degree at the State University of New York (Buffalo), Hill returned to Southern, and in 1972, a five-man team placed fifth at the NAIA Nationals.

Hill began his collegiate coaching career at Florida A&M University, where he was head track coach and head basketball coach from 1962 to 1964.

A fine athlete himself, Hill played basketball and competed in track while a student at Southern. After graduation, he entered the University of Buffalo, where he completed his Ed.M. (master's) degree in 1961. While at Buffalo, Hill won the New York state AAU decathlon title with 7250 points in 1962, after finishing second in 1961. He also played on the Western New York AAU champion basketball team both years, and was a member of the New York State National AAU team each season.

Hill's coaching success has been remarkable, to say the least. In addition to the five national titles at Southern, his teams have

won seven conference championships (five at Southern, two at Florida A&M). Since coming to San Diego, Hill has been building the team slowly, with a sixth place in the Pacific Coast Athletic Association in 1973 and a fourth last year.

Perhaps even more phenomenal has been his success with individual athletes. At Florida A&M, Hill coached Bob Hayes to world records at 100-yards and 100-meters, as well as to the 1964 Olympic gold medal. At Southern University, Hill coached high hurdlers Willie Davenport, the 1968 Olympic champion, and Rod Milburn, who won the 1972 Olympic gold medal. Both athletes tied and broke numerous indoor and outdoor world records in the hurdles. Also at Southern, members of Hill's teams broke the world records in the 440-yard, 880-yard, and mile relays. The last two years at San Diego State, Hill coached Steve Williams, who tied both the 100-yard and 100-meter world records.

**CARY WEISIGER**  
Assistant Track Coach



Cary Weisiger is in his second year as assistant track and head cross country coach at San Diego State.

Weisiger is a graduate of Duke University, with a B.A. in economics. During the day, he is a stockbroker at Paine, Webber, Jackson, and Curtis in San Diego.

Cary, a three-time All-America at Duke, once held the American record in the 1,500-meter run at 3:39.3. His best time in the mile was 3:56.6, and he was ranked fifth in the world in 1963 and seventh in 1962 as a miler. He broke four-minutes in the mile ten times.

As a member of the U.S. national team on several occasions, Cary toured Europe, Russia, New Zealand, Israel, the West Indies, and Canada.

Weisiger served as an officer in the Marine Corps for three years and was track coach of the Camp Pendleton Marines track team which placed athletes on the U.S. team that competed in Moscow.

Just prior to coming to San Diego State, Cary was cross country coach at Christian High School in San Diego, where his team won a league championship in 1972.

**TIM ROGERS**  
Assistant Track Coach



One of San Diego State's best decathlon men ever, Tim Rogers, will be helping to coach the field events this year.

Rogers, a two-year letterman for the Aztecs, placed second in the PCAA decathlon in 1973 and fourth last year. His best mark was 6316. He also threw the javelin 205-4 and high jumped over 6-6 as an Aztec.

Last summer, Rogers upped his decathlon best to 6650, while his individual bests include a 227-0 javelin throw and a 6-10 high jump.

The 23-year-old Rogers is currently completing his degree in management at the school.

## 1975 SEASON OUTLOOK

Facing a "rebuilding" year (only seven returnees; only seven seniors) after last season, the Aztecs may be coming back stronger this year.

Coach Dick Hill has recruited a strong group of newcomers to replace most of the losses, and has filled in some of the gaps that existed in 1974.

"We are opening up the season without some of the outstanding sprint talent we had last year, but we have a sounder nucleus of athletes from which to build a successful program," Hill said.

Leading the list of returnees are two athletes who placed fifth in last year's NCAA championships, Harold Williams (100), and Garry Greene (440 IH).

Williams, with bests of 9.3 and 20.6, will be leading a noticeably weaker sprint group. (However, several of last year's sprinters were injured at least part of the year.) Harold is just a junior, and he reached his 1974 peak at the NCAA meet, where he ran 9.4 for fifth in the 100 before pulling up in the 220.

Williams will be joined by Don Moore, a 21.8, 48.2 sprinter from Morse High in San Diego. Along with Quinard McDonald (48.8), a high school teammate of Moore's, and Williams' 48.7, the Aztecs have a solid core for the sprint and mile relays.

Garry Greene, whose 51.7 lifetime best earned him a fifth in the NCAA 440 intermediate hurdles final last season, is back for his senior year as two-time defending PCAA titlist. Greene, with a 14.3 best in the 120-yard high hurdles, also took a second in the PCAA meet in the highs.

Mark Ables will also return in the intermediates to back Greene. Ables finished third in the 1974 PCAA intermediates, and ran 53.0 during the year. Newcomers in the hurdles will be Quentin Wheeler, a freshman from Monmouth Regional High School in New Shrewsbury, New Jersey, who placed fourth in last year's International Prep Meet, running 13.9 over 39-inch highs. Wheeler also ran 52.8 for the 400-meter intermediates. Another top recruit is Dave Hoover from Southwestern JC, a 53.7 intermediate hurdler who was seventh in the Southern Cal JC meet.

Leading a strong group of newcomers in the distances is Mike Avrea, a competition-proven runner from El Camino JC. Avrea, a 4:09.0 miler, finished third in the California State JC meet last year, and had an excellent cross country season last fall. Another prize catch is Earl Robinson from West Los Angeles JC, who ran 4:09.6 as a freshman, and dropped to the 880 last year, where he ran 1:51.8.

The half-mile could be the Aztecs' best race, with freshmen Odie Huffman (1:51.8; Monmouth Regional, New Jersey), who was 3rd in the International Prep Meet; and Brian Donohue (1:52.5; Taft High in Wodland Hills), 4th in the California High School meet; and junior Steve Wulf (1:51.4; Pierce JC), sixth in the California JC meet last year. Rounding out the distance crew is Allen Hazard, who ripped a 14:20 three-mile in the fall.

The jumps will be weak. In the pole vault, Jim Collins returns with a best of 15-6; he was third in the PCAA last year.

Ron Hill, a freshman from Long Beach Poly, joins the team with a 6-6 high jump. Another freshman, Tom Bush from Kearny High in San Diego, brings a 45-10 mark to the triple jump.

The weight events will be vastly improved. Mark Stevens, a 56-0 shot putter at USC, is eligible after a redshirt year. Joining him will be Steve Parisen from Pierce JC, who boasts a 53-1 best in the shot. Rich Comber, another redshirt transfer, has thrown the discus 164-0, and was fourth in the PCAA meet for San Jose State in 1973.

The Aztecs were 1-4 last year in dual meets, and picked up a fourth place in the PCAA finals. The potential exists to improve on that record greatly this year, and the potential is in an all-around team. Hill says, "Everyone is looking forward to being part of the most compatible and balanced team on campus in three years." If that potential is realized, the Aztecs may be on the way back.
