WOODY WILSON RELAYS RESULT IN GOOD & BAD

THE GOOD: GATORS SET SCHOOL RECORDS. The purple-clad Men of San Francisco set two new school records and tied another as they competed in the Woody Wilson Relays at U.C. Davis last Saturday. The 880 yard Relay record was lowered for the second time this season to 1:28.7 by the quartet of Lloyd Remo (Lansy), Kevin Adams (Serramonte, Skyline CC), Darryl McLaurin (Blair, Pasadens CC), and Gordon Snyder (S. San Francisco, Skyline CC). The Gators finished second in the relay.

The Sprint Medley was the second relay record to fall. Gordon Snyder (22.3), Lloyd Remo (22.7), Kevin Adams (49.0), and George Cagle (Novato) (1:52.5) combined for the 3:26.5 record.

Junior John Moreno (Terra Nova, Skyline CC) took fourth in the Steeplechase and tied the school mark in only his second ever steeple effort. The time of 9:23.6 tied the Gator record set by Rick Cano in 1974. John was barely edged by Chico's Karl Schaechterle (9:18.2) and Humboldt's Barry Anderson (9:22.0). The FWC race should prove to be just as fiercely contested.

THE OTHER GOOD. Ike Allmond (Serramonte, Skyline CC) remained undefeated in FWC competition in winning the High Hurdles in 15.1. Running into a wind and favoring a tender calf muscle, Ike showed that he will be tough in the FWC Championships. Senior Len Swelle continued his steady improvement by upping his seasonal best to 155-11 in the Hammer Throw. Junior Jim Draper (San Carlos, Canada JC) vaulted 13-0 to tie his PR for a two-foot increase since his first meet. Jim is coming back after a two year absence from pole vaulting as he has been concentrating on soccer since high school. Senior Kevin Adams recorded his fastest relay split of the season, 48.3, in anchoring the Mile Relay to a second place finish.

THE BAD: GORDON SNYDER PULLS HAMSTRING. A week after being named College Athlete-of-the-Week for his iron-man performance against U.C. Davis, Senior Gordon Snyder pulled up lame in the 440 yard Relay. It appears doubtful that Gordon will be back before the FWC Championships. Last season the versatile sprinter was sidelined by mononucleosis and his hard luck continues this season. With seasonal bests of 10.9, 21.8, and 49.3, his absence will be hard felt by his running Gator teammates.

CHICO STATE NEXT. The Gators travel to Chico next Saturday for their next dual meet. The Wildcats have a strong squad that is ranked high in the FWC statistics in a majority of the events. With sprinters Gordon Snyder and Ron Hightower (Galileo) out with hamstring pulls, the usually potent sprint corps will be hard pressed. The quartermile should again provide points for the Gators with Kevin Adams and Darryl McLaurin plus Abe Leuvenos (Mission, CCSF). With PRs of 49.2 and 48.1r, Abe will be making his first start in the one lap event after spending 5 weeks recovering from a muscle strain.

Ike Allmond (14.7, 55.2) will face second ranked Ken Orenshaw (14.8) in a high hurdle showdown and Gregg Biber (54.9) in the intermediate hurdle race. Miller Kian McCarthy (Jamaalpais, Marin JC) (4:19.7) will have his hands full with Tim Stone who anchored Chico's Distance Medley with a 4:13 leg. Jim Brown (Cordova, Cosumnes River) will match his 6-9 high jump against Rick Ytterwick's 6-10 leap.
