

## METRIC DISTANCES AT CAL

With the installation of a new track surface Edwards stadium has been converted to a metric distance. Consequently all of Cal's home track meets are recorded in metric times.

The conversion of Edward's track oval from 440 yards to 400 meters reduces the distance by some 2.34 meters. There is a precise conversion factor that has been formulated by the International Association Track Federation (IATF). That conversion table appears at the bottom of this page.

Since Cal has gone to a metric distance ALL CAL RECORDS IN THIS BOOK HAVE BEEN CONVERTED AND SO APPEAR IN THAT MANNER IN THIS PUBLICATION.

In the 100 meters, 200 meters and 110 meter HH use .24 to find the difference in races that are run in meets that use hand timing. In the 400 meters, 400 meter IH and the 400 meter relay use .14 in meets that use hand timing.

Records will be accepted in 1/100's with full auto timing only for 100 meters, 200 meters, 110 meter HH, 400 meters, 400 meter IH and the 400 meter relay. Events above 400 meters can be hand timed, but only 1/10's will be used for record purposes.

## TRACK PRESS INFORMATION

**PRESS CREDENTIALS** — All requests for working press credentials, photo passes and parking permits for California track and field meets should be directed to John McCassey, Director of Public Relations, University of California, Berkeley, Calif., 94720. Photo requests will be limited to daily newspapers, wire services, network and local television and national sports publications. Requests should be made well in advance of meets to allow time for credentials to be mailed.

**PRESS BOX** — The working press box is located on the West side of Edwards field. No elevators are available; for easiest access to the working area it is recommended to take the stairs leading through the stands.

**TELECOPIERS** — Due to the increasing use of Xerox Telecopiers and other copying devices, the Public Relations Office cannot provide telephones on press row for such devices. Persons planning to use such devices at the Edwards Stadium press box should make their own arrangements with Pacific Bell Telephone representative Dennis Rozelle (415) 645-7488. Phones will be available in the Sports Information office located in Harmon Gym.

**SERVICES** — Working press will receive a program and scorecard and complete summaries of all Intercollegiate Men's track meets at Edwards Stadium.

## 1978 CALIFORNIA TRACK OUTLOOK

This season marks the sixth year at Cal for head coach Erv Hunt, and once again he feels that this year's team will be "the best team I have had at Cal in terms of quality and depth."

That fact is brought out when one takes a close look at the Top Ten list of Cal performances. Twenty athletes on the 1977 Cal team broke into the Top Ten a total of 25 times in 18 events. Twelve of those performers are back for the 1978 season.

Hunt continues his philosophy that the Bears will take the necessary time to develop their respective skills in the dual meet competition, and strive for the top times at the Pac-8 and NCAA championships. "I have always felt that it is more important to perform well at the championship meets than in dual meet competition because that is where the real test inevitably comes."

Hunt has more to offer the track and field fan than quality athletes. California's 1978 schedule matches the Bears against six of the top twelve finishers at the 1977 NCAA meet, and four of those teams will invade recently renovated Edwards Stadium.

San Jose State opens the list on March 11, with world-class hurdler Dedy Cooper. One of the premier triangular meets in the country comes to Edwards April 8, when defending NCAA champion Arizona State joins fourth place Washington State and its host of brilliant distance runners. Finally, the season wraps up with the Big Meet against Stanford and world-class long jumper James Lofton.

This year's Cal team will have its share of quality athletes to meet the challenge. Hunt has lured some outstanding performers to Cal during the off season. Heading the list is 1976 Olympian Quentin Wheeler. As a soph at San Diego State, Wheeler won the NCAA intermediate hurdles in a meet record 48.55 time.

Joining Wheeler is javelin thrower Wayne Guy, a relative newcomer just last year to track and field. As a freshman last season at Southwestern JC in San Diego, Guy had a throw of 253'3". Another standout is sprinter Mike Farmer, who has a lifetime best of 10.1 100 and 20.7 200 meters.

While the list of newcomers is impressive, the veterans are to be watched as well. Andy Clifford returns for his junior year after capturing the 1500 meters title at the Pac-8's with the second best time in Cal history, 3:42.3. Clifford went undefeated in the 1500 last year in dual meet competition and lost only two 800 races. His ability to double should be a real strength to the Bears.

Another standout is Keith Taylor in the 200 and 400 meters. Taylor, Hunt thinks, can approach world-class caliber with hard work and dedication. As a freshman, the 6-5 Taylor anchored both relays and clocked bests of 10.3 in the 100 meters; 20.6 in the 200 meters; and 45.9 and 46.1 splits on 1600 relay legs.

Paul Santiago in the discus is a tough competitor who had a lifetime best 187'11" last year, and a shot put best of 58'1¼". Pole vaulter Larry Hintz hopes to bounce back to his school record form of two seasons ago, when he cleared the 17' mark.

Gary Blume, Damon Wood, and Hal Schulz all figure to improve on their steeplechase times, which figure among the school's best. Blume ran the second fastest (8:56.8) and Wood the third fastest (8:58.9) SC on the Cal list, while Schulz broke the freshman mark with a 9:01.3, ranking him fifth.

Hunt is counting on Holden Smith and freshman football standout Floyd Eddings to provide depth in the sprints and relays. There is also strength in numbers and quality from newcomers Lloyd Guss, Walt Pratt, and Ray Smith in the hurdles. Veteran Ron Brown will strengthen the 400 and 800 meter events as well as the relays.

Decathletes like Tori Lewis, Greg Canfield, and Dave Steen figure strongly in the Pac-8 and NCAA competition, but should provide points in several events in dual meet competition. Lewis' strongest

events are the pole vault and javelin. Canfield figures to help in the hurdles and long jump, and Steen in the long jump and high jump.

Hunt figures that Cal will once again be strongest in the running events, especially in the short to middle distances. In the field events, he is pleased with the strength in the javelin and pole vault, but is concerned with the jumps.

The following is how the coach views his team event by event.

**100-200 METERS** — "We should be very strong in both events. The addition of Mike Farmer will really help. He is capable of running 10.3 and 10.4 consistently. We have numbers with Holden Smith (10.4/21.4), Keith Taylor (10.3/20.6), Floyd Eddings (10.4/21.3) and Bill Burrell (10.6/21.4). We have depth to compete with just about anyone in dual meet competition, and with Farmer and Taylor, we should figure in the Pac-8's."

**400 METERS** — "This could be a very strong area once again for us. Taylor is capable of being a world-class quarter-miler, and he will concentrate on this event as a soph. We lost a fine runner in Paul Wallace (46.3). Ron Brown (47.6) can help us once again. Freshman Lloyd Guss has a lifetime best of 47.7, and any of the 400 IH people could provide quality depth — Quentin Wheeler, Walt Pratt, or Ray Smith."

**800 METERS** — "I think that Ron Brown could become a real surprise in this event. He has a best of 1:51.3, but is capable of running 1:48, I think. There will be very few times that Andy Clifford will not figure as a favorite, despite doubling in the 1500 meters. Clifford (1:49.2) is a very strong and dedicated runner. Again, the depth factor becomes very evident, with Quentin Wheeler, who is capable of running a 1:50. Carl Van Fleet, who redshirted last season, has a 1:54.0 lifetime best, and Robin Clarke has a 1:53.2."

**1500 METERS** — "Clifford makes this one of our stronger events. He is capable of breaking the school record, after winning the Pac-8 title last year with the second fastest time in school history, 3:42.3. Damon Wood is another hard-working individual, with a lifetime best 3:49. He is a strong runner who can provide us depth when needed in the 1500. Freshman Felix Elieff will be someone to watch. He has a lifetime best 4:16 in the mile as a prep. Freshman Paul Burke also has a 4:16 mile time."

**5000 METERS** — "This is a good solid event for us. Senior Gary Blume has a lifetime best of 14:16.4. Soph Hal Schulz will split between this and the steeplechase. He has a 5000 meter best of 14:22.0, and I think he is capable of making strides toward improving. Wood will see action in this event also, and he has a 14:38.6. Elieff ranked in the top ten nationally among preps with a two-mile time of 8:55.7, and I think he will be an immediate help to us."

**3000 SC** — One of two strongest events in terms of depth, particularly in dual meets. Three of the top five steeplechase performers in the school's history will be back this year. Gary Blume ran the second best time, 8:56.8, Damon Wood ran an 8:58.9 for the third fastest, and Schulz as a freshman broke the frosh mark with a 9:01.3 for fifth. The impressive thing is that none of them had ever competed in this strategic event, and I think all are capable of running under 8:50."

**HURDLES** — "At the season's start, I would say the 400 IH goes from our weakest event of a year ago to the strongest single event for this year's squad. In the 110 highs, we lose a little in terms of quality (Carl Florant, 13.6), but by mid-season, we should be close. Quentin Wheeler is a world-class intermediate hurdler. He has a 48.55, which enabled him to win the NCAA as a soph, and that mark still stands as the meet record. Walter Pratt (51.5), freshman Lloyd Guss (52.06), Ray Smith (52.6), and Mark Uribe (52.8) are all capable of running under 51. The newcomers are of fine quality, and Uribe has shown tremendous improvement. Smith will double in the 110 HH, and he has a best of 14.1. Wheeler has gone 14.2, and freshman Peter Grimes has a 14.0 (HS). Smith is the guy I think can break 14.0 early, and he figures to be our top high hurdler."

## RELAYS

400 — "This will be a better squad than last year's, which finished fifth in the NCAA meet. This is the best flat out speed since I have been here. This squad might rank with the best in the school's history. The 1975 team that set the school record (39.1ye) didn't have the speed of this group. Holden Smith and Keith Taylor are back from last year's group, along with Mike Farmer, Floyd Eddings, Quentin Wheeler, and Bill Burrell."

1600 — "That could be one of our top events, and the right combination could break the school record. This is a strong group. It will probably come down to any of these five guys comprising the team — Mike Farmer, Lloyd Guss, Keith Taylor, Ron Brown, Quentin Wheeler. I think they could match the school record, 3:03.9. We have a better selection to choose from this year."

## FIELD EVENTS

**JAVELIN** — "Potentially, this could be our best field event, with Wayne Guy providing some real quality. Guy had a 253'3" in his first year of competition. Soph Doug Cooper just kept working hard all season, improving his lifetime best nearly every week, and scored with his sixth place finish at the Pac-8 meet, when he threw 218'7". Decathlete Tori Lewis has a best of 217'5". Guy could make all the difference in the event for us. If he continues to improve, he is very capable of reaching the school record of 267'4".

**SHOT PUT/DISCUS** — "We have a good guy to carry our load in both events. Paul Santiago has one year behind him, and if he just improves on that, he should be among the best. In the discus, he ranks third all-time at 187'11", and finished 5th at the Pac-8's. He had a 58'1¼" in the shot for a lifetime best and 6th at the Pac-8's. Santiago ranks as one of the best combination performers in Cal history for these two events."

**POLE VAULT** — "This could be a very strong event. We have one man who has cleared 17 feet, and two over 16. Larry Hintz has taken third place at the Pac-8 meet for the past two seasons, including his school record 17'0¼". He has experience and has been very consistent for us. Tori Lewis and Kevin Stevenson, a transfer from San Mateo, have both cleared 16'0".

**LONG JUMP** — "We have some capable people in this event with three guys over 24 feet. I am not sure how far that will get them at this level of competition. One of them might be capable of popping a big one, but we'll have to see. Greg Canfield has a best of 24'4" wind-aided, and Floyd Eddings had a prep best of 24'4", also windy. Another freshman, Dave Steen, has a 24'2". We will just have to see what we can do to help their development."

**TRIPLE JUMP** — "Mike Dobbins, once agains, will be our top man. He finally broke the 50 foot barrier at the Pac-8's to earn sixth place. He could jump better than last year. Freshman Ramoan Grubbs has great potential because of speed and natural spring, and he will develop. He placed in the state meet as a prep last year with a 48'7", and also has a 49'0½" indoors."

**HIGH JUMP** — "We have four guys capable of being a big help. All have gone over 6'8". Heading this group is Jeff Good (6'10"), Dave Steen (6'9"), Peter Imperial (6'8¾"), and Ramoan Grubbs (6'8"). Greg Canfield has jumped 6'7¼", and all but he are freshmen."

**DECATHLON** — "This will be one of our strongest events at the Pac-8 meet. It could be the source of a lot of points. We have the top returnees from last year — Greg Canfield (6981 best) was fourth, and Tori Lewis (6941) was third. Dave Steen is a super prospect (6917). They should all figure among the top four, for sure."

## ERV HUNT

### HEAD COACH UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA

Hunt is entering his sixth season as the California track coach. He is only the sixth man to hold the position in the school's 76 years of track and field history.

At the time of his appointment by former track coach and currently athletic director Dave Maggard, Hunt was the youngest coach ever named to a head position at the University of California.

Hunt has accomplished many things in his short five year span as head coach including an impressive 28-16 dual meet record which includes five consecutive victories over Oregon St. Previously Cal had only beaten OSU once in dual meet competition.



Born and raised in Fresno, Calif., Hunt enjoyed both an outstanding prep and collegiate career in his hometown. He was a three sport athlete at Edison H.S. where he was a standout defensive back in football; played guard in basketball and ran the hurdles in track.

His 14.0 time in the 120 high hurdles was the fastest JC time in the United States in 1969. He finished second in the State JC meet that year. He also ran a 37.7 in the 330 intermediate hurdles that same year. Hunt also "toyed" with several field events, most notably his 49'8" triple jump.

He transferred to Fresno St. on a football-track scholarship following his two years at Fresno CC. Hunt played defensive back under Darrell Rogers, now at Michigan St. He won Little All-American honors as the Bulldogs won two conference titles.

At the conclusion of his college football he was chosen in the sixth round by the Green Bay Packers. He suffered a back injury in his second season as a pro which forced an early retirement.

Following his brief pro stint, Hunt returned to Fresno and taught elementary school for a brief time before teaching at Clovis H.S.

In 1972, Cal's head track coach Dave Maggard hired Hunt to handle the runners.

Hunt's accomplishments went beyond the playing field. In 1968 he was chosen by the Fellowship of Christian Athletes as the "Scholar-Athlete of the Year".

Erv and his lovely wife Jackie make their home in Richmond with their two children, Jamie, 6 and Ericka, 1.

## JOHN WEDEL

ASSISTANT TRACK COACH  
UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA

Wedel returns for his third season with Erv Hunt, handling the Cal field event performers, something that he had done very successfully prior to coming to Cal and something that he continued to do once at Cal.

After three successful seasons under head track Ted Banks at the University of Texas-El Paso, Wedel returned to his native California in the fall of 1975.

Working closely with the field event people at Cal the past two seasons, the Golden Bears' field event performances were impressive in many areas. The most notable was the NCAA title won by decathlete Ed Miller, Larry Hintz's becoming the first 17' pole vaulter in the school's history, and numerous personal bests including Tom Murphy's 7'0" high jump and his qualifying as a finalist in the NCAA meet.



While at UTEP in a similar capacity, the Miners won two consecutive NCAA outdoor titles and one indoor title. In the indoor meet the field event performers accounted for 30 of the 38 championship points.

Wedel was born and raised in the Los Angeles area. He attended Lynwood HS where he graduated in 1965. He developed into a fine high jumper at Compton JC

where he had a leap of 6'8".

His junior year he moved on to the University of Arizona where he high jumped 7'0", which marked him as the second man in that school's history to clear that barrier.

Wedel was offered a position of working under Jack Rose at Long Beach St. It was his association with another of Rose's assistants, Ted Banks, that led to the El Paso move, because in 1973, Banks was appointed the head track coach at the University.

## BRIAN MAXWELL

ASSISTANT TRACK COACH  
DISTANCE RUNNERS



Maxwell returns for his third season helping Hunt with the Cal distance runners. He also coached the cross-country team this past fall. Three years ago, Maxwell was one of Cal's top two and three milers. He narrowly missed earning a berth on Canada's 1976 Olympic team as a marathoner.

Born in London, England, he attended Victoria Park High School in Toronto, Canada. As a Canadian prep, Maxwell was the Canadian junior 5000 meters champion and later ran the fourth fastest Canadian national 10,000 meters time (28:58.4). While at Cal, he established the fifth fastest two and three mile times as well as the school's fourth fastest 3000 meters time.

## AL RAGAN

SPECIAL COACH

This "special assignments" coach and Cal go back a long way.

He began at Cal as a fine hurdler, a three-year letterman in 1925-27. Since 1928, he has been an assistant in the track program at Cal, a long association that includes service under every coach in Cal history. Ragan himself served as head track coach for three war years, 1943-45, during the absence of Brutus Hamilton.

His 1943 Cal squad defeated USC, the last win for the Bears in that series. That same team later took second in the collegiate championships.

Despite an announced retirement in 1968, Ragan has stayed on under Sam Bell, Dave Maggard, and Erv Hunt to offer time and advice to Bear tracksters.

Al and his wife Fern make their home in Berkeley.



## DAVE MAGGARD

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

When Athletic Director Dave Maggard assumed the lead position at his alma mater in February, 1972 Cal's Athletic Department was suffering through a major turnover in staff, the start of a three-year NCAA probation, declining alumni support, and less-than-overwhelming enthusiasm among students for Cal varsity sports.

Assuming an athletic director's position at a major university the size of California is one thing but to assume a position at an institution like Cal with the hallmarks of size, diversity and excellence at the age of 32, thus becoming the university's youngest athletic director, is quite another thing.

He oversees a total of 25 varsity, junior varsity and freshman teams in 16 sports and some 1,100 athletes which places Cal as one of the largest and most diversified athletic programs in the country.

Setting things right, as Maggard did, involved in large measure picking the proper personnel to implement policy guidelines and decisions only he could formulate. Thus came to life the Bear Backers — the fundraising life blood of the Department that each year gathers donations for the continuance of the Grant-in-Aid program. In each of the past two years, the Bear Backers raised over \$400,000, setting a new pinnacle for Cal fundraising. Here also the many sub-units of the department were streamlined, with new faces and new approaches working to perform one of the more dramatic turnabouts in recent years.

Maggard himself is a study in winning. Graduating with a BA in Physical Education in 1962, he earned one football letter and three track letters, setting in the process a Cal shotput record that still stands. He began teaching and coaching on a high school level while pursuing his own athletic goal, the U.S. Olympic Team. As a 67-foot putter, he made the American team for the 1968 games finishing fifth despite illness.

The next year he came back to California as track coach Sam Bell's assistant, succeeding Bell in 1970, and then going ahead in his rookie year to capture the NCAA Championships.



## PROFILES

**GARY BLUME SENIOR DISTANCES 8:56.8 SC, 14:16.4**



One of the better distance runners in Cal history, Blume is third on the 5000 meter list and second in the steeplechase and 10,000 meters. Placed 5th in the 1977 Pac-8 steeple, a race he ran in the second half of the season along with the 5000. Set school indoor two-mile mark in San Diego last year, 8:40.9. Also a fine cross-country runner. Did not run any competitive 1500's in '77, but has a 3:53.5. Attended Marina HS in San Diego.

**RON BROWN JUNIOR 400-800 47.6, 1:51.3**



Scored in four meets in the 400 meters and in three in the 800 in 1977, as well as being a regular entry in the 1600 relay with a season-best relay leg of 47.0. Improved his 800 best three seconds, and Hunt thinks that with more experience, that could be his best race. Transferred to Cal last year after one year at Diablo Valley College, where he placed sixth in the 1976 state JC meet. Prepped at Kennedy HS in Richmond.

**BILL BURRELL SOPHOMORE SPRINTS 10.6, 21.6**



Saw action early in 1977 in 100 and 200, also running in several meets on the sprint relay. As a soph, needs to develop consistency. As a prep at Tennyson HS in Hayward, was the Hayward Area champion in both sprints, also running on both relays. Economics major.

**GREG CANFIELD SENIOR DECATHLON 6981 Points**



Returns much improved after placing 4th in the 1977 Pac-8 decathlon with 6806 points. In 1978 has already upped his PR 164 points, at the Cal All-Corner Decathlon in February. Could see dual meet action in the high jump (6'7" PR in February), high hurdles, javelin, and long jump (24'4" best). Scored in four 1977 meets in LJ. While at Chabot JC, placed third in the state decathlon. Attended Dublin HS, winning EBAL LJ, LH, and running on the sprint relay.

**ANDY CLIFFORD JUNIOR 800-1500 1:49.23, 3:42.3**




One of the highlights of the 1977 season, Clifford was undefeated in the 1500 through the Pac-8 meet, and also doubled when needed (see list below). He established PRs in both events, and with the experience of running in the NCAA and AAU meets, Hunt expects him to be ready to run with the best. A tough competitor, he will be called on again to double in several meets. Was the 1974 State HS mile runnerup at Sunny Hills HS.

**MIKE DOBBINS****JUNIOR TRIPLE JUMP 50'0"w**


Slightly windy jump at 1977 Pac-8 meet put him over 50 foot mark, earned him 5th. Legal PR 49'11 $\frac{1}{4}$ " came vs. SJS. Was consistently close to 50 feet last year, winning three dual meets and placing second in three others. With that consistency and two years' experience, Hunt feels he could be on the verge of great improvement. Won the 1975 state HS meet at Merced HS, and doubled in the long jump. Also made All-NorCal football as a prep. Architecture major.

**FLOYD EDDINGS FR LONG JUMP-SPRINTS 24'4"w, 10.4**


Joins the track squad after a fine debut in football, where he emerged as the Bears' top deep threat in 1977, with 17 catches for 321 yards and three TD's. 18.9 average per catch led the team, and he had an 83-yard TD. Versatile athlete with prep decathlon experience (Alabama state champ as a soph) and a load of untapped potential. Could see action in a lot of areas.

**FELIX ELIEFF FRESHMAN DISTANCES 4:16, 8:55.7**

Time-wise, Elieff is the best distance man to come in under Hunt. 8:55.7 two mile is good enough to rank on Cal's all-time list. Will need to make the adjustment to the longer races at the college level. Placed third in 1977 state HS two-mile for Highland HS in Bakersfield.

**MIKE FARMER****JUNIOR SPRINTS 10.1, 20.7**

"Mike Farmer," says Hunt, "is the best sprinter I've had here." Extremely talented, he's been brilliant at times in the past. Early season workouts have been very good, and Hunt figures he should develop into a consistent standout. Farmer should see action in both short races, and both relays, as he has turned in a 46.6 1600 relay split. Was a member of the 1974 state champion team at Wilson HS (S.F.).

**JEFF GOOD FRESHMAN HIGH JUMP 6'10"**

Very young yet physically, at 6'5" Good has the size, build, and ability to be a tremendous jumper. Personal best came as a high school junior at Rio Mesa HS in Camarillo, jumped 6-8 last year. Hasn't competed very long in track, experience should add to his performances.

**RAMOAN GRUBBS FRESHMAN TRIPLE JUMP 48'7"**

An all-around athlete, could contribute in several areas - 400, intermediates, as well as triple jump. Will concentrate on the triple jump, where he is improving his technique. Has an indoor best 49'0 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Prepped at Blair HS in Pasadena, placed 3rd in state 330 LH's.

**LLOYD GUSS FRESHMAN HURDLES 52.06, 14.7**


Figures to be one of the top freshmen on the 1978 squad. Has already run some good races, including 52.06 intermediates and 47.7 open 400 meters. Just now learning regular workouts, which should develop consistency. Will see action in both hurdles, and 1600 relay. Attended West Vancouver HS in British Columbia.

**WAYNE GUY JUNIOR JAVELIN 253'3"**

Immensely talented athlete with great size, 6'6", 230, who has only been throwing the javelin one season. A basketball and baseball player while at Chula Vista HS, he took up the javelin after seeing film of Soviet star Janis Lusia. In 1977 at Southwestern JC, he threw over 230 feet in five meets, his best coming at the West Coast Relays in Fresno. With some work on technique, he poses a strong challenge to the school mark of 267'4" held by Bruce Kennedy.

His PR would rank him second on Cal's all-time list, and he figures as a contender for conference and national honors.

LARRY HINTZ SENIOR POLE VAULT 17'0 $\frac{3}{4}$ "



Two-time place winner in probably the toughest pole vault conference in the country. Came on after a slow start in 1977 to take third in Pac-8, matching his 1976 finish when he set his personal best. Very steady and an outstanding competitor, as one of the few seniors on the 1978 squad he should provide team leadership. Developed from a 15'6" vaulter at Buchser HS in Santa Clara into Cal's first 17-foot vaulter. Physical Education major, married to wife Sonja.

TORI LEWIS SENIOR DECATHLON 6941 Points



Placed third in the Pac-8 last season, and hasn't fully utilized his potential yet. Established PR at 1977 Cal All-Comers decathlon, tallied 6922 at the Pac-8 meet, and has already scored 6930 in 1978. Valuable dual meet performer in javelin (217'5" PR, 1st vs. UCLA) and pole vault (16'0"). Won the 1976 California state JC decathlon at Hancock JC (6859), after a stellar prep career as a hurdler/vaulter in Idaho.

WALTER PRATT JUNIOR HURDLES 51.5



Comes to Cal from Bakersfield College, where he was runnerup in the 1977 state JC meet. His personal best 51.5 was the second fastest in the country at the JC level last season. Hunt feels that some work on his technique, along with the level of competition, should help Pratt drop his time even farther. Attended Foothill HS in Bakersfield, winning the Valley championship in the high hurdles.

PAUL SANTIAGO SR SHOT PUT, DISCUS 58'1 $\frac{1}{4}$ ", 187'11"



Ranks as one of Cal's all-time performers in the weights, third longest in the discus and fifth in the shot (only two others make the top 10 on both lists). Seasonal and career best in the shot came at the Pac-8 meet, placed 6th. In the discus, PR came against UCLA; had his 2nd longest at the Pac-8, placing 5th. Invaluable to the team because of his dual strengths, and after last year's transition to the top level of competition, Hunt expects him to be one of the best double weightmen around. 1976 state JC shot put champ at American River after prep career at Highland HS in Sacramento. English major.

HAL SCHULZ SOPHOMORE DISTANCES 14:22.0, 9:01.3 SC



Split dual meet activities between 5000 and steeple in 1977 as a freshman. Finished 7th in the Pac-8 steeple. Two cross-country campaigns and one in track have seasoned him, will make him one of the distance mainstays. Finished 3rd in 1976 AAU Jr. Cross-Country, ran at the World Championships in Germany March 1977. Prepped at Redwood HS in Marin County where he had a 13:52 three-mile best.

HOLDEN SMITH SOPHOMORE SPRINTS 10.5, 21.4




Gained valuable experience in 1977 during his first season ever in track. Along with Keith Taylor was the top entry for the Bears in the 100 meters, also running the 200 and the sprint relay. **RAPHAEL SMITH JUNIOR HURDLES 14.1, 52.6**





**DAVE STEEN FRESHMAN DECATHLON 6917 Points**



Very young, but an outstanding athlete. Won the decathlon at the Canada Summer Games after helping Burnaby Central HS to the British Columbia provincial championships with wins in the high, long, and triple jumps, and pole vault. Should help the Bears in dual meets in the long (24'2") and high (6'9") jumps. Also has a 47-foot triple jump. Scored 6856 at the Cal All-Comers decathlon, and should be a factor in the Pac-8 meet.

**KEVIN STEVENSON JUNIOR POLE VAULT 16'0"**



Addition of this JC transfer gives the Bears solid dual meet strength in the vault. Achieved his personal best at the College of San Mateo. Attended Aragon HS, where he was named Most Improved as a 14-foot vaulter after winning school MVP honors as a senior in football. Business major.

**KEITH TAYLOR SOPHOMORE 200-400 20.6, 45.9r**



Had Cal's top times in the 200 and 100 in 1977 while also anchoring both relays. Earned All-America honors as a member of the sprint relay. Will concentrate on the 200 and 400 in 1978, where Hunt feels he has world-class potential. With great speed and size, only needs to achieve consistency. Helped the Bears nail down the 1977 Big Meet with photo finish wins in the sprint relay and 100 meters. Played on the 1977 Cal JV basketball squad. Attended Piedmont Hills HS in San Jose, running the 100 through 800.

**MARK URIBE JUNIOR HURDLES 52.8**



Was the top performer in the intermediates for the Bears in 1977. With the influx of great talent in that event, Uribe will make it a solid one and Hunt expects it will help his progress. Set Cal frosh mark in the IH in 1976. As a prep, did it all for Roseville HS, running three hurdle events, the 100, and 400, and participating in the horizontal jumps. Won both hurdles for four years in Sierra Foothill League. Social Welfare major.

**QUENTIN WHEELER JUNIOR HURDLES 48.55**



An outstanding individual as well as athlete, Wheeler enters his first season at Cal after sitting out the 1977 season. "Quentin is stronger and faster than in '76," says Hunt of the 1976 NCAA intermediates champion. "I can't indicate strongly enough what a difference having him on the team makes, as a stabilizing force and an example to the others. He knows what it takes at the top." The Montreal Olympian is a fine team man, and could be called upon in six events — both hurdles, 400, 800, and both relays. Has a 1:52.6 800 time, 46.4 relay leg, and 14.2 HH. Was the New Jersey state prep champion in the highs and intermediates. Political Science major.

**DAMON WOOD SENIOR 3000 SC, 1500 8:58.9, 3:49.8**



Had a fine competitive season in the steeple in 1977, running that race in five meets and winning them all, with PR coming against USC. 1500 best came in 1976, ran that only once last season, instead doubling back three times in the 5000. Should be a solid contributor again in any of the three events. Won the Golden Gate Conference two mile at College of San Mateo after attending Woodside HS. Civil Engineering major.



## EDWARDS STADIUM'S NEW LOOK

After 45 years of one of the richest track traditions in the world, Cal's Edwards Stadium received a new track surface after an exhausting fund raising drive.

Long considered the finest track facility in the world, the 22,000 seat stadium received a face lift in 1977 with the installation of a Tartan Surface not only on the oval but on all the infield runways as well.

The track oval was also changed to a metric distance, thus changing from 440 yard to the more contemporary 400 meter distance.

Edwards was originally finished in 1932 and at the time it was the only, "pure track" stadium in the world. Edwards stadium has been the site of seven NCAA Championship meets, one National AAU Championship, an All-American Invitational in 1966, the 1971 US vs. USSR meet, and six Kennedy Games Meets.

The stadium is named after Col. George C. Edwards, as is the field adjoining it to the east.

In 1957 the oval itself was dedicated in the name of Walter Christie, California's first track coach, 1900-32, and in the early sixties "friends of California track", raised funds to build the Walter Christie bench which stands just outside the running track on the west side of the field.

With funds that remained after the bench was built, the electric clock that stands atop the scoreboard to the north was purchased.

Prior to 1977, the track was last redone in 1965 with Fresno clay and cinders. The site of 10 world records, 16 American records, and at least 18 collegiate records, the new surface will once again upgrade Cal's Edwards Stadium to one of the finest track facilities in the world.

The bid for construction and installation of the Tartan surface was awarded to West Coast Surfacing of Redwood City, California at an estimate cost of \$240,000.



# CALIFORNIA

The University of California at Berkeley has grown over more than a century to become a city of intellect across the bay from San Francisco. The University of California's athletic department fields nearly 25 varsity, junior varsity, and freshmen teams in 16 sports to place it as one of the largest and most comprehensive athletic programs in the nation.

Excellence, diversity, creativity and size are the hallmarks of the University of California at Berkeley.
