

Eagle spikers clipped at the wire

This year might be different for the Mountain View High track team.

In years past it's become almost a tradition for the Eagle tracksters to come up short. Last year, it was almost taken for granted when their varsity went winless.

But the Eagles might be ready to win this year and served notice by scaring Peterson before falling 68-64 in Santa Clara Valley Athletic League action.

In the league's only other track opener, Awalt knocked off Gunn 77-58 as Rick Weyers and Kobert Smith won two events for the Spartans. Chris Fank was Gunn's only double winner.

Peterson's Trevor Ngai tipped

the scales against Mountain View, winning the long jump with a 19-5 leap and the triple jump by hopping 40-6½.

The four-point deficit is the closest Mountain View has come to winning a meet in two years. And with some returnees from last year's championship junior varsity team, Mountain View could cause some trouble for its opponents.

The Eagles' girls' team already has.

The Mountain View girls' squad beat Peterson 52-47 for its first win in the school's history. Sandy Zobel won the 100-yard dash, 110 low hurdles and anchored a winning mile-relay team. Junior Linda

Loney had a double, winning the mile and two mile.

Wet tracks fail to slow preps

Rain wasn't the only big winner in Thursday's high school track and field meets.

Although six of the eight scheduled meets were washed out, some of the best marks of the Central Coast Section were set.

Two meets were held. Los Altos defeated Awalt 77-59 in Santa Clara Valley Athletic League action on Foothill College's all-weather track and Cupertino bounced Homestead 81-55 in the De Anza Athletic League in a puddle-jumper.

Robert Smith of Awalt was a triple winner for the Spartans. He ran a 1:58.2 in the 880 to edge Los Altos' Allan Goes by just a half of a second in the day's top race. Smith also won the mile in 4:46.9 and the two mile in 10:12.5.

Rick Weyer doubled by winning the shot put (53-0) and discus (145-0 1/2).

But those efforts weren't enough to hold off the Knights as Bill Graber and Craig Copeland doubled up to lead Los Altos.

Graber high jumped 6-7, the top leap in the section this year, won the 120 high hurdles with a 15.3 clocking and added the anchor leg on the Knights' mile relay squad. He grazed the bar at 6-10 1/2 in the high jump.

Copeland won the 440 in 51.3 and doubled by taking the 220 in 23.5 and also ran legs on both the 440 and mile-relay teams.

Cupertino is the league favorite in the DAAL and showed why as Dave Avila and Steve Guthrie win just about anything they choose.

Avila won the 880 (2:02.2), mile (4:40.8) and two mile (10:15.2). He is the defending league champ in the mile.

Guthrie won four events in the DAAL finals a year ago and is back on the track.

He ran the first leg on Cupertino's 440 relay team to get warmed up before winning the 100 in 10.4 and the 120 high hurdles in 15.6.

All of those winning marks rate high for this early in the season, ac-

ording to Los Altos coach Leon Long.

Long celebrates birthday as Knights roll over Panthers

When it comes to track in the Santa Clara Valley Athletic League one team stands alone: Los Altos High.

Under coach Leo Long, the Knights have won 17 SCVAL titles since 1958 and compiled a record of 161-6 in that span.

Championship No. 18 may well be on the way this year and the Knights took a solid step in that direction by waxing Santa Clara 105-31 Thursday.

In other SCVAL meets, Cubberley edged Awalt 74½-61½, Peterson throttled Palo Alto 92-40, Buchser sailed past Mountain View 101-35 and Gunn and Wilcox tied 68-68.

It was Long's birthday Thursday and he celebrated by watching his Knights rip Santa Clara as 17 lifetime bests were set.

Most coaches are happy when they can get one double winner. But Long had four of them, as Allan Goes, Fred Grolle, Craig Copeland and Bill Graber all doubled.

Grolle and Goes were especially impressive. Grolle took the triple jump with 44-11 and the long jump with a leap of 21-10, both league highs Tuesday. Goes won the 330 low hurdles in 39.8 (league high) and 880 in 2:05.

"This team is young but maturing every week," Long said.

Cubberley showed it may be the only team that can run with Los Altos in its win over Awalt.

The Cougars received double victories from sprinters Bill Green and Jeff Moss. Green captured the 100-yard dash in 10.1, edging Jeff Moss (10.3), and also wrapped up the 440 in 51.4. Moss won 120 high hurdles (15.6) and 330 low hurdles (41.1).

But as good as the Cubberley sprint corps is, the Cougars have what could be a fatal weakness in their field events. Awalt almost swept all six events as Ricky Weier won the shotput (51-7½) and discus (144-8).

Coburt Smith's double in the mile and 880 coupled with Awalt's near-sweep in the field events still wasn't enough. Smith ran a 4:29.7 mile and is nearing top form--last year he ran a 4:18.

Buchser whipped Mountain View but the Eagles' Charlie Pasantino captured the 100 in 10.7 and 220 in 24.0 to ease some of the Eagles' pain.

Gunn and Wilcox deadlocked when Wilcox came from behind to win the mile relay, the final race of the day. The Titans had built a 68-63 lead, partly on the efforts of distance-specialist Scott Pringle, a winner in both the mile and two-mile.

Peterson sailed past Palo Alto as the Pirates won every track event and were boosted by Trevor Ngai's victories in the long jump and triple jump.

3/18 Pioneers plow Injuns

Cupertino High appears to be a solid favorite for the De Anza Athletic League track and field title this year if the Pioneers continue to get the kind of performances they did last week.

Cupertino got three victories from junior Dave Avila and two each from Steve Guthrie and Carl Ezerski in a 83-53 thumping of Fremont. Elsewhere, Monta Vista surprised Sunnyvale 72-64 and Homestead downed Saratoga 75-61.

Avila turned in an iron-man performance by winning the 880 (1:58.5), mile (4:34.9) and two mile (9:54.3) while Guthrie added victories in the high (15.0) and low (39.3) hurdles. Ezerski added wins in the shot put (49-4½) and discus (171-3) to pad the Pioneers' margin in a meet which accounted for many of the best marks and times in the Central Coast Section this year.

A 56-11 shot put mark by Joe Sorenson and a 174-7 discus win by

Steve Struble highlighted Sunnyvale's loss to Monta Vista, which sported a 14-6 pole vault triumph by Ross McAlexander.

renial-champion Knights in the SCVAL.

But it's not too likely.

Not with the likes of Bill Graber, Allan Goes, Mark Rychlik, Steve Alexander, Fred Grolle, Tom Deeny and a host of others in the Knights' uniform who made Buchser, 4-0 entering Tuesday's meet, look like just another track team.

Long was ecstatic over his team's performance.

"This was the showdown," Long said. "We wanted this one, I tell you. Our kids were really up for this.

"We have a tradition at Los Altos that an athlete can earn a 'blue suit' to work out in if he makes certain marks. When we won the state meet in 1970, we had 10 blue suits.

If you happened to see what looked like cannonballs flying through the air Thursday, don't be alarmed.

They weren't fired from cannons. They were the result of some outstanding shotputting in the Cupertino-Sunnyvale De Anza Athletic league track meet, which Cupertino won handily 99-36.

Five shotputters came up with efforts of 50 feet or better, topped by Sunnyvale's Joe Sorenson's winning mark of 55-1, the fourth best effort in the Central Coast Section this year.

In the day's other track action, Los Altos upped its record to 6-0 by running past Palo Alto 103½-31½ to highlight Santa Clara Valley Athletic League action. Awalt edged Peterson 73-62, Gunn outdid Mountain View 83-49, Buchser upended Cubberley 89-47 and Wilcox defused Santa Clara 81-55 in other SCVAL meets.

Homestead snuck past Lynbrook 70½-65½ in a DAAL meet.

The shotput is far from sports' most glamorous event. Spectators often don't even realize a good put from an average one until minutes

after it is performed and its distance is announced.

But Thursday it was impressive.

The way Sunnyvale's Sorenson, Steve Struble and Don Thompson and Cupertino's Tim Small and Carl Ezerski were putting the 12-pound ball, spectators may have thought it was raining cannon-fodder.

The SCVAL's quickest 100

Cougars' Green Hornet stings a 9.75

There's no doubt at all that Cubberley's Bill Green is ready for Friday's Santa Clara Valley Athletic League track and field trials at Foothill College.

Green ran the fastest 100-yard dash in the history of the Cubberley track Tuesday, ripping off a 9.75 century to lead the Cougars to a 76-60 victory over Gunn to wrap up the dual-meet season.

Green's clocking is the fastest non wind-aided 100 in the Central

Coast Section this year. He also won the 440 with a 49.8.

In other meets Tuesday, Awalt handed Palo Alto an 85-50 setback and Los Altos capped the SCVAL dual-meet season with a perfect 9-0 record by whipping Mountain View 96-39.

The Knights frosh-soph team, however, saw their unbeaten record fall as Mountain View won 74-62 to tie Los Altos for the dual-meet title.

Cubberley is expected to be a serious threat in the SCVAL finals with its corps of burners. Green

logged the fastest times in the SCVAL this year in the 100, 220 and 440 and may be the top sprint man for those three races in the CCS.

The Cougars also had the SCVAL's fastest relay teams in both the quarter-mile and mile this year, an indication of the team's overall speed.

Awalt's Marty Smith ran what he plans to be his last two-mile in his career against Palo Alto and clocked a school record 9:23.5, the fourth best time in the CCS this year.

Smith plans to concentrate on

the mile in the future. His 4:19 set earlier this year is the SCVAL's top mark and only 2.5 seconds off the CCS' top time.

Los Altos polished off Mountain View to end the dual-meet season undefeated. The Knights' dual-meet championship will have equal weight with the outcome of the SCVAL finals, scheduled for Saturday, May 13th at Foothill College.

Mountain View ruined Los Altos' plans for undefeated seasons in varsity, frosh-soph and girls' division by handing the Knights the setback in the frosh-soph meet.
