For the Spartans, former Wilson High of San Francisco star Mike Kirtman helped collect points in three events. He won the 110 high hurdles in 14.2, finished second in the 200 at 21.1 and was on the winning 400 relay.

San Jose's Stan Ross parlayed a difficult double into a first and second place finish. He won the 1,500 in 3:52.1 and took a second in the 800 at 1.56.5.

Clifford standout in Cal track meet

Cal's Andy Clifford won the 800 meters in 1:49.8 yesterday to set a Cal-Sacramento State dual meet record as the Bears hosted the Hornets, Bay Area Striders and the West Valley Track Club in a non-scoring meet in Edwards Stadium.

Finishing second behind Clifford in the faster second heat was Cal freshman Mike White, timed in 1:50.4.

Mike Farmer of Cal won the 100 meters in 10.5, teammate Mike Marlow took both the long jump (23-81/2) and triple jump (49-7) and Peanut Marma of the Aggie Running Club took the 5,000 meters in 14:22.2.

The Bay Area Striders' A team of Gordon Banks, Millard Hampton, Norbert Payton and Eddie Hart won the

400-meter relay in 40.3.
