Dixon breaks tape in record 35.07.6, two-tenths of a second faster than Craig Virgin's 1981 time

lead field of 55,000

A WOMAN came up to Rod Dixon after he had broken the course record in the Examiner Bay to Breakers yesterday. Her husband was one of 55,000 runners who finished far behind the 31-year-old New Zealander, and she wanted Dixon to write him a message.

"To John," she wanted the note to say. "Better luck next year. Rod Dixon."

Both Dixon and the woman chuckled as he scribbled the note, because they knew that John really didn't need luck, any more than did the thousands of other runners who paraded 7½ miles to the beach. Most didn't worry about their time. They were exhilarated just to be healthy and running in the nation's biggest road race on a gloriously cool and clear day. The note was a gag, like so much else in this traveling carnival.

In the serious part of the Bay to Breakers, Dixon and Oakland's 34-year-old Laurie Binder, who won the women's division for the third time in four years, used the Hayes Street hill to run down formidable rivals in the 71st running of a race that has grown from 24,000 to almost 60,000 runners in just two years.

The 6-foot-2, 158-pound Dixon beat Craig Virgin's record time of 35.07.8 by just two-tenths of a second. Dixon ran the first half of the race extremely fast and then coasted on his long legs downhill through the park. Virgin last year had run the second half of the race much faster than the first.

But both runners won their races on the half-mile 250-foot-high Hayes Street hill, which begins 2¼ miles into the race.

As Dixon neared the hill, he was running even with four guys. Then Jon Sinclair, the 24-year-old hill runner from Fort Collins, Colo., attempted to break away. Dixon stayed with him and, as they reached the steeper blocks of the hill, left his opponent behind.

Sinclair, who had been tripped up at the start and later was bumped by a car backing out of a driveway on the

back side of Hayes hill, was not able to recover. Dixon led by 100 yards at the halfway point in the Panhandle, and by more than 200 yards in Golden Gate Park.

Learning as he rounded the bend onto the Great Highway that he had a shot at the record, he sprinted hard and lunged through the tape in a time that almost exactly matched Virgin's last year.

"Well, Rod," Virgin said later, "there's only one way to settle this.... Has anybody got a coin?"

Witnesses smiled. Virgin, who missed this year's race because of an injury, was implying that he and Dixon might meet next year in a Bay to Breakers that could well lower the record to less than 35 minutes.

"If Craig had been in the shape this year that he was last year when he set that record, it would have been a great race," said Dixon, who was surprised that he got away so early yesterday in his first Bay to Breakers. He thought
