

Jet Harriers Garner FUHS District Title

Sunnyvale High was the scene of the 1st annual Fremont Union High School District Cross Country finals yesterday, which saw the host Jet harriers come out on top.

Two events for varsity and junior varsity were run over a 1.8 mile course. In the varsity event, Fred Castro of Fremont edged out teammate Art Regalado with respective times of 9:40 and 9:42. Sunnyvale's Alex Sandigo and Irving Borges followed in third and fourth spot. Sandigo clocked 9:50, while Borges did 10:01.

The remainder of the top ten came in like this: Bill Northam (F) 10:15, Marty Burgess (SV) 10:20, John Bernal (SV) 10:22, Mark Strauch (SV) 10:22, Sonny Torres (SV) 10:32 and Joe Aquiniga (Cup) 10:33. Aquiniga of Cupertino impressed many with his performance in the varsity race—he is only a freshman.

Sunnyvale swept the first four spots in the J. V. event. Dave Fitzgerald flashed home first in 10:23, while Dave Larsen (10:38), Steve Carey (10:54), and E. Bonderant (10:58) followed. Fifth place went to Fremont's F. Mauldin in 11:01.

In the point standings, which is figured on a lowest points wins basis, Sunnyvale won in the varsity with 28 points, while Fremont followed with 37 and Cupertino tallied 68. Sunnyvale had 16 points in J. V. competition, while Cupertino netted 55. Fremont did not have a team. The Jets picked up 15 points in the sophomore division, while the Pioneers and Indians failed to enter a full team. Cupertino spoiled a clean sweep for Sunnyvale by taking the frosh class with 20 points. Sunnyvale entered only a partial team, while Fremont did not enter.
