## Cal Cross Country

Hillsdale, Terra Nova and Carlmont High schools were represented on the First All Northern California cross-country team, selected by Track and Field News.
Hillsdale and Terra Nova placed two runners each on the $20-\mathrm{man}$ team of the best prep harriers in Northern California, while Carlmont had a single representative to the team in sophomore Mike McCann.

Ralph Likens and Marcel Hetu, Hillsdale's distance running duo who set a new national record for the two-man, 10 -mile relay last week, were the Knight representatives named to the team. Both seniors, Hetu was ranked fifth and Likens seventh in the team choices, which were based on the combination of times posted on tracks and grass courses.
Terra Nova placed Dan Vincent and Bob Hernandez in fourth and 18th positions. Vincent, one of the county's best runners this season, had a 9:26.7 clocking on the track and a 9:39 time for the Stanford grass course.

## Two Sophomores

MeCamn was one of two sophomores who made the team. The other was Mike Ryan of Wilcox High school in San Jose, a runner who has the most promise of any distance star in the sport today.

On the basis of age, 15-yearold Ryan is rated the greatest distance running prospect in United States or world history. No track man in history has ever run so fast at such any early age. Rated the top rumer on the All Nor-Cal squad and the Cross-Country athlete of the year, Ryan was beaten only once during the season, by a margin of inches. His $9: 30.7$ clocking over a grass course was better than 13 of the other All Nor-Cal rumners' times for the two-mile track distance.
All-Northern California teams were named for high school, junfor college, and senior college ranks.
