San Mateo 26, Carlmont 6: Buzz Williams has one of the best backfields in the Mid-Peninsula League.

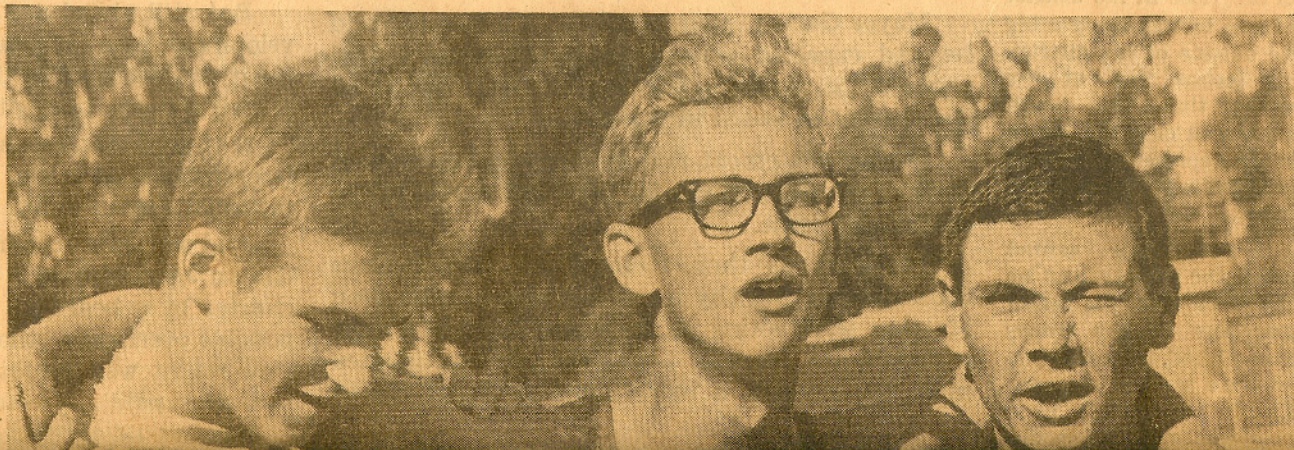
Jefferson 7, Ravenswood 6: This could go either way.

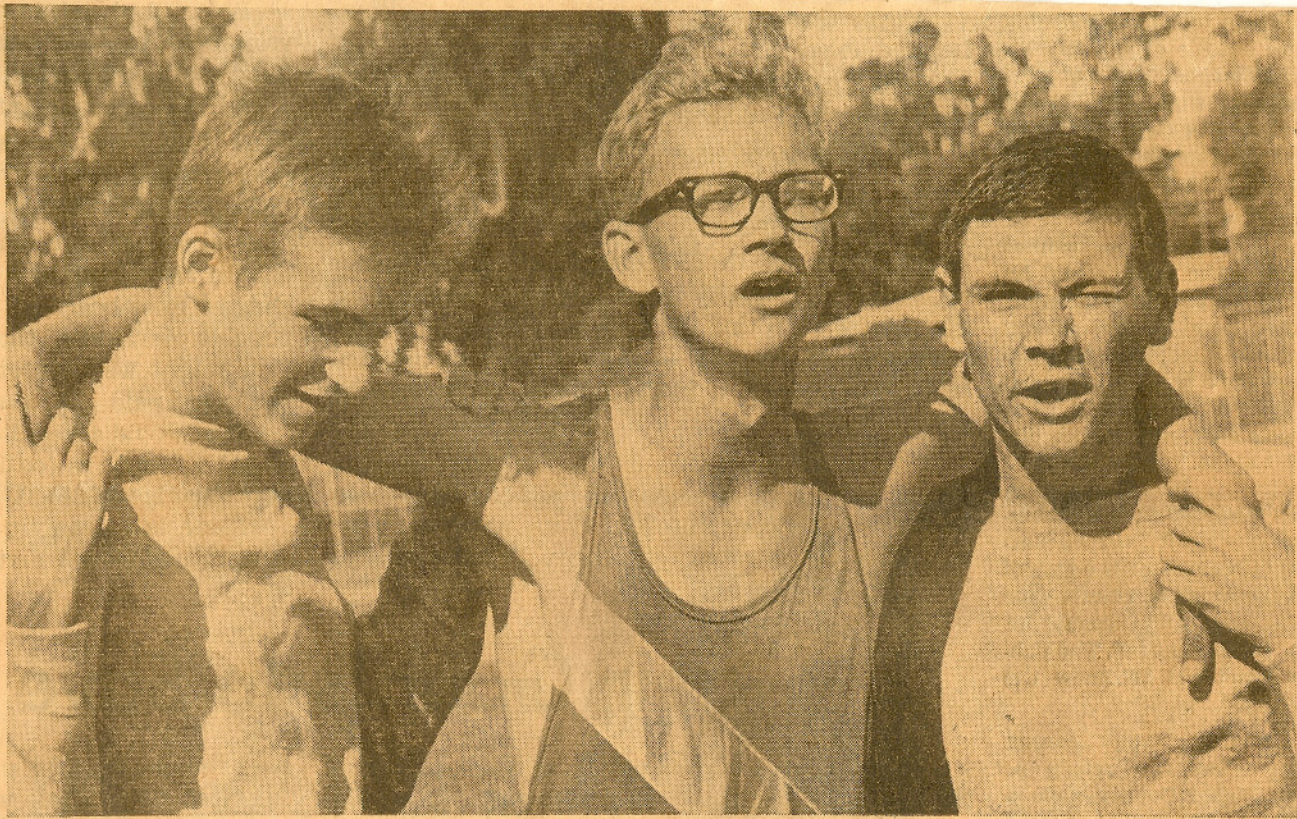
