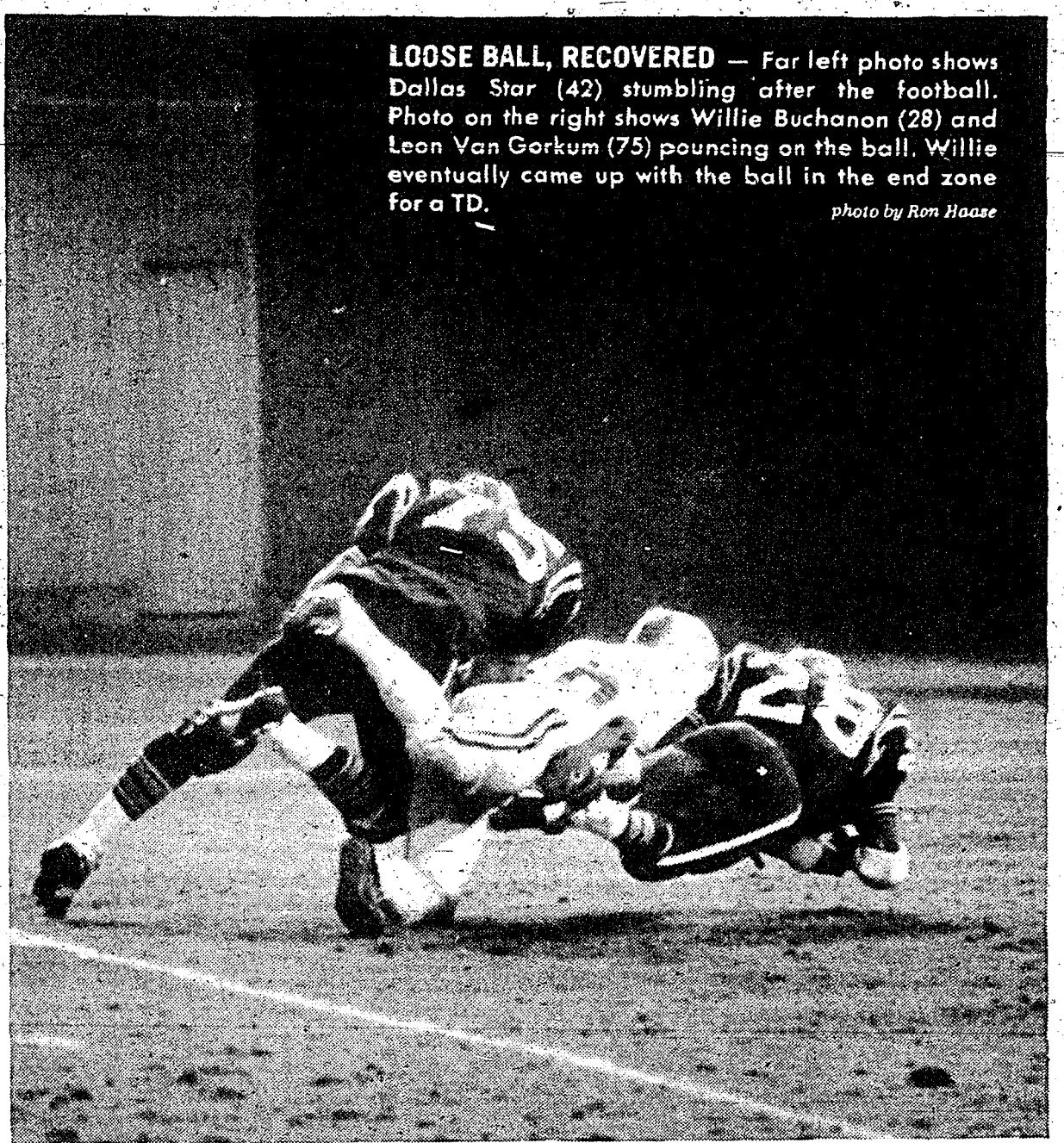

## Depth key to cross country victory over Cal State L.B.

If there is to be a key word to describe last Saturday's effort by the State cross country team, it had to be depth. The harriers under coach Tony Sucec used depth to its fullest advantage and won a big meet over Cal State Long Beach 42-45.

In the process of topping the 49'ers, the Aztecs also got revenge as the Pacific Coast Track Club, the team that nipped State two weeks ago by three points, was a distant third at 78 points. The San Diego Track Club was fourth with 82 points, and the Southern California Striders were fifth with 123 points.

When the word depth is used it means that State had 10 runners ahead of Long Beach's fourth man, and all 10 of the State harriers finished within 70 seconds of each other.

John Jacobson was the top finisher for State, ending up in fifth place. After Jacobson, State had Dave Matherly in seventh, Otis Martin in ninth, Harry Renfro in tenth, Tom Davidson in 11th, Bill Englehard in 12th, and Scott Claypoole in 13th.

### GOOD DEPTH

"We had real good depth," said Sucec, "This overall was our best team effort of the season." The key of the depth can be reflected back to last week when Sucec made the team all run together in practice (including himself) to get the feeling of being together.

"We run these drills to give the team the feeling of being part of

the group," said Sucec, "And it gives them the ability to stay together."

Sucec felt that the key to the win was the determination of the team and the overall condition of the guys themselves.

"This meet and our practices prove one thing," said Sucec, "Any one runner on the team is as good as any other runner and they know it."

### RENFRÖ COMES ON

This can be proven by the fact that Renfro finished fourth Saturday for the Aztecs, after never being in the top ten finishers. Claypoole also moved back into seventh position after being knocked out of the top ten.

Tom Heinomen of the Pacific Coast Track Club won the race in a time of 30:06. Cal State Long Beach had the next two finishers in Bob Macias, defending PCAA champion, in 30:21, and Mike Wagenbach in 30:28. George Scott of Pacific Coast was fourth in 30:28.

Jacobson came in with a time of 30:34 over the fast six mile course, and Matherly finished with a time of 30:56.

Someone may wonder what good is depth in this kind of race where only the top five finishers score points for each team? Well, this can be explained by the fact that, as in the case of Saturday's meet,

### BUMPS LONG BEACH

By having seven finishers in front of any given man, for instance Long Beach's fourth man, he gets bumped a place and has points added to his score, but the sixth and seventh men that do the bumping do not actually score points, just give more to the opposition.

If Englehard and Claypoole hadn't beaten Long Beach's fourth and fifth man, Long Beach would have won the meet, by a point, but since they got bumped back a place, State won by three.

Anyway, State will practice their bumping this week and then fly to San Jose Friday for an important meet with the Spartans, Saturday on the San Jose State campus course.
