SUMMARY: Oct. 16-17

It was a weekend of confrontations, as front running teams in each conference in the upper Midwest battled each other, with a couple close ones resulting. In the Big Ten, undefeated Minnesota stayed on the winning track, edging Michigan State 26-29 at East Lansing. Defending Big Ten champ Garry Bjorklund covered the five miles on the often rugged MSU course in 25:05.5, a course record. MSU soph Ken Popejoy stayed with the Minnesotan til the last quarter mile of the race but Bjorklund's strong surge gave him the win. Popejoy ran 25:09, followed by Gophers Don Timm (25:18) and Tom Page (25:27). MSU's Dave Dieters and two other Spartans followed in sixth and seventh but the 1-3-4 finish had virtually iced the meet for Minnesota.

In a confrontation of Mid-American powers at Kent State, Bowling Green dropped Western Michigan 25-30 over a six mile route. Western also topped Toledo 15-50 and Kent 19-41 in the same meet. No other scores available. Sid Sink and Dave Wottle, beaten by Western's Gary Harris a week earlier at the Notre Dame Invitational, turned the tables this time and it paid off for Mel Brodt's crew as they remained undefeated and very possibly the top squad in the Midwest. Sink traveled the course in 29:46.8 while Wottle turned in a 29:57 and Harris just a step back in 29:58. Kent State's Ed Norrism finishing his collegiate eligibility this fall, was fourth in 30:05.

Indiana bounced back from a loss to Minnesota to whip Illinois and Miami at Champaign Saturday, but individual honors went to Illinois ~~junior~~ junior Rick Gross. Indiana dumped Miami 23-32 and stopped the Illini 24-35 for Illinois' first dual meet loss. Miami upended Illinois 27-30. Gross finished the flat five mile loop at Illinois in 23:50, going thru the first two miles in 4:28 and 9:12. The old course mark was 24:24.7 by Illini Greg Dykstra. Indiana's Bob Legge grabbed second in 24:13 while Dennis Bayham of Miami finished in 24:16. Hoosier Steve Kelley (24:19) and Illini Lee LaBadie rounded out the top five. LaBadie ran 24:24. *Dick Cole* *old address*

SUMMARY: Oct. 23-24

Mid American conference teams ran away with top honors in two multi-team meets over the weekend. Bowling Green romped to the title in the all-Ohio meet at Ohio Wesleyan (Delaware) while Western Michigan trounced four other Michigan schools in Michigan State's Spartan Invitational at East Lansing. In the Big Ten, Minnesota continued unbeaten with a win over Drake while contenders Illinois and Indiana also triumphed.

Bob Bertelsen of Ohio ran 24:11 over a short five mile course at Delaware to win the all-Ohio meet but Bowling Green placed men second, third, sixth, seventh and 13th to win the title with 31 points. Miami was second with 63, Ohio 3rd with 73 and Cincinnati fourth with 103.

At East Lansing, Gary Harris snapped the week-old course mark of 25:05.5 (set by Garry Bjorklund) with a 24:47.6 to lead the Broncos to a convincing win with 19 points. WMU runners placed third, fourth, fifth and sixth behind Harris to ice the win. Host Michigan State was second with 56 points.

Minnesota topped Drake 19-43 with Garry Bjorklund winning over the Gophers' course in 24:48.6. Drake's Lynn Lee was second but Minnesota placed runners third through seventh ahead of the next Drake man....Illinois whipped Ohio State 17-42 at Champaign. Ken Howse was the individual winner over the flat Illini course in 24:31....Indiana clubbed Notre Dame 15-50 Friday at Bloomington...Steve Kelley traveled the five mile route on the tough Hoosier course in 25:19, almost 30 seconds better than the old course mark set earlier this year by teammate Bob Legge....Northwestern turned the tables on Purdue at Wilmette Saturday, beating the Boilermakers 21-34. Rick Saxton ran 25:37 to get the win for the Wildcats....Iowa beat Augustana (Ill.) 22-34....

With all the major meets coming up within a week or two, top contenders for Big Ten and Mid American titles remained unbeaten. Minnesota rolled to another dual meet win, this time a 15-50 verdict over Big Ten rival Iowa. Soph Garry Bjorklund stayed undefeated....Illinois, with Rick Gross impressive in a 24:41 winning effort, ran to the crown in the Illinois Intercollegiate meet at Carbondale with 39 points....Indiana, with top Hoosiers Bob Legge and Steve Kelley taking the week off, eased to a 50 point win in the Big State meet at Indianapolis over a four mile route....Miami dumped Michigan State 21-36 at Oxford while the Spartans handled Cincinnati 26-29. Miami topped Cincy 23-34; as a triangular, Miami had 29, MSU 47 and Cincy 48...Bowling Green routed Eastern Michigan 21-37 to remain undefeated and head into this Saturday's MAC meet at Athens as the favorite....In other Big Ten action, Wisconsin dumped the Chicago Track Club 21-31 at Madison while Ohio State fell 18-41 to Air Force and 24-31 to Adams State...Air Force whipped Adams State 21-38....

Looking ahead: Bowling Green is the favorite in the Mid American with a big meet win at Notre Dame and a dual win over top challenger Western Michigan...But Mel Brodt's crew eked out a one point win in 1969 and the stage could be set for more of the same this year....In the Big 8, Kansas still rates as the favorite despite losses to Southern Illinois and Oklahoma State.....

SUMMARY: Nov. 6-7

Western Michigan dethroned Bowling Green as Mid American champ and Missouri toppled Kansas to take the Big 8 title in major cross country action last weekend. Drake regained the Missouri Valley title and Indiana copped the Kentucky USTFF crown to highlight other top Midwest action.

In the Big Ten, Minnesota moved steadily toward its title defense Saturday at East Lansing as the Gophers dominated the Northwest Open at ~~xx~~ Minneapolis. But the other Big Ten contenders, Indiana, Illinois, Michigan State and Wisconsin all won too and the conference affair is just about up for grabs. Minnesota, on the basis of its undefeated dual season with big wins over Indiana and MSU, is rated the favorite.

Bob Bertelseth of Ohio, completing his collegiate eligibility this fall, clocked 30:11.2 on his tough home course to win the MAC title, some 25 seconds ahead of second placer Gary Harris of Western Michigan. Western, under new Coach Jack Shaw, placed men in the 2-3-6-8-12 spots to wrap up the title. Previously undefeated Bowling Green, minus No. 2 man Dave Wottle, who may be out for the year with an injury, fell to third with 56 points behind Ohio's 50.

Nebraska's Greg Carlberg clocked 18:53.5 on a rolling course at Oklahoma State and Missouri placed runners in 7-9-12-13 and 19 to win the Big 8 crown with 60 points. Oklahoma State had 72, K-State 82, Colorado 83, Kansas 100, Iowa State 135, Nebraska 152 and Oklahoma 161. Defending champ Jerome Howe of Kansas State slipped to fourth in 18:57.

Drake's Lynn Lee ran away with the Missouri Valley title in 19:42 for the second straight year and his teammates placed third, tenth, 12th and 13th to regain the title for Bob Ehrhart's crew with 39 points. Wichita State was a close second on its home course with 43 points.

Indiana placed men fifth, eighth, tenth, 11th and 18th to grab the Kentucky USTFF crown at Louisville with 52 points, just ahead of Cincinnati, with 54. Western Kentucky's Hector Ortiz was the individual titlist in 28:53 on the six mile course.
