'Pre' paces UO runners to fast time

Sophomore Steve Prefontaine's 13:25.5 clocking for three miles led a University of Oregon team of runners Saturday to an apparent new record in the annual "postal meet" competition co-sponsored by the United States Track & Field Federation and Track & Field News.

The total time for the first five finishers was 68:22.6, bettering the mark of 68:36.8 set Nov. 8 by an Oregon Track Club team led by Arne Kvalheim and Ken Moore, who tied for first in 13:26.2. The OTC team's November effort had broken the 1967 "postal meet" record of 68:56.0 set by an Oregon varsity team.

Following Prefontaine to the finish line were Steve Savage in 13:36.2, freshman Randy James in 13:40.0, Pat Tyson in 13:50.4, and Mike Long, junior college transfer, in 13:50.5.

Altogether, the first nine finishers in the chilly time trials Saturday morning were under 14 minutes. The others were Rick Ritchie, 13:54.5; Mike Lyons, 13:56.0; Wes Smylie, 13:56.3; and Mark Savage, 13:59.1.

In a separate six-mile run for OTC runners, Arne Kvalheim and Dave Wilborn tied for first in 29:20.2.

Nils Emilsson, a freshman from Sweden, won an 880 event in 1:56.2.
