"COLLEGE OF SAN MATEO CROSS COUNTRY HISTORY"

Cross Country was organized at C.S.M. in the fall of 1961 by Fred Baer and Floyd Strain and met with quick success. Ralph Lee won the Big Eight Conference individual title that season and the Bulldogs placed fourth in the league.

The following season, under track and cross country coach Berny Wagner, the Mateans won eight league and practice meets and lost but one--to conference champ San Jose City College in the first league meet of the season. Jim Huff took the Golden Gate Conference individual title for the Bulldogs.

After that loss to San Jose, C.S.M. built a streak of 24 straight dual meet victories that wasn't broken until 1965. Included were two G.G.C. team championships. The Bulldogs were fourth in the first ever junior college state meet in 1964 after finishing third in Northern California.

In the Golden Gate Conference Finals, C.S.M. finished second to Foothill in 1962 and won the meet in 1963, 1964, and 1967.

C.S.M. individual league titles came in 1961 (Lee), 1962 (Huff), 1966 (Ted Lydon), and 1967 and 1968 (Mike Dailey).

Coach Phil Casaroli piloted the Bulldogs to 7-0 league records the past two years, running up near perfect scores in most meets. And last year, paced by sophomore Mike Dailey's individual triumph, the Bulldogs took their first Northern California crown.

In 1969, coach Bob Rush took over as the Bulldog harrier mentor. Starting off slow in 1969, the C.S.M. cross country team has gone three straight undefeated seasons since then. C.S.M. has a 21-0 league dual streak and 22-0 dual meet record.

CROSS COUNTRY COACH BOB RUSH

Bob Rush succeeded Phil Casaroli as track and cross country coach at the College of San Mateo in 1969.

Rush attended Sacramento Junior College and graduated from San Jose State College in 1958. He ran track and cross country at both colleges.

Rush started his coaching career at C.K. McClatchy High School in Sacramento where he was an assistant coach in track, cross country and football. In 1963 he moved to San Mateo High School as Head track and cross country coach. After six successful seasons at San Mateo High, Rush came to C.S.M. Since then his teams have won 3 straight undefeated in the Golden Gate Conference Championship. The track team won the Conference in 1970. In 1972 the cross country team was fourth in the state missing third by one point and second by four points.

Rush lives in San Carlos with his wife, Marianne, and two sons.

- 1970--C.S.M. won G.G.C. dual meet crown (unbeaten) and finals crown; fifth in Northern California and eight in the California State Meet.
- 1971--C.S.M. won G.G.C. dual meet crown (unbeaten) and finals crown (Jose Cortez individual winner); fourth in Northern California and eighth in the California State Meet.
- 1972--C.S.M. won G.G.C. dual meet crown (unbeaten) (Jim Van Dine individual winner) and finals crown (Jim Van Dine individual winner) and second in the Northern California (Jim Van Dine individual winner) and fourth in the California State Meet (Jim Van Dine fifth place).
- 1973--C.S.M. third in G.G.C. losing its first G.G.C. dual meet in four years. C.S.M. lost to both Diablo Valley College and San Jose City College. They are still, however, rated one of the top teams in the state.
