





A History of the CIF/Reebok State Championships

The CIF offers state championships in six different sports; cross country, girls' volleyball, wrestling, basketball, track and field and golf.

Track and field, the longest running state championship, was held for the first time at Fresno High in 1915 and reached the 74th year mark during the 1992 CIF/Reebok State Track and Field Championships. Except for the war years from 1941-45, the track and field championships have been held annually.

Early championships were conducted at high schools, YMCA's, universities and fair sites including: the Sacramento Fair in 1918, the San Bernardino Fair of 1919, the Bakersfield Fair in 1920 and the Stockton Fair in 1922. The 1992 CIF/Reebok State Track and Field Championships marked the fifth consecutive year that Cerritos College, Norwalk was the host site. 1974 featured the first year of girls' competition in the CIF/Reebok State Track and Field Championships with the setting at Memorial Stadium, Bakersfield.

Accomplished athletes in various sports dotthe list of California High School competitors in the track and field state championships. Names like Dwight Stones, an Olympic medalist in the high jump, Rafer Johnson, a Gold Medalist in the decathlon, and Sherri Howard, an Olympian in the 4 X 400 highlight the list.

Track and field stars from California High

schools have gone on to succeed in other sports as well. Lynn Swann from Serra High in San Mateo, James Lofton of Washington, Los Angeles and Dokie Williams of El Camino, Oceanside each made a name for themselves in professional football, and were state champions in the long jump - a feat Swann accomplished on two occasions (1969-70). Henry Ellard, of Hoover Fresno and now with the Los Angeles Rams won the CIF/Reebok State title in the triple jump in 1979.

After track and field, the CIF/Reebok State Basketball Championships were established in 1916 and were held until 1928. The first state basketball championship was played between Whittier High and Berkeley High at Whittier High School on March 25, 1916. The final result: Whittier 31-20. In 1989, Glendora High standout Tracy Murray set a record for most points scored with a phenomenal 64 - more than Berkeley and Whittier combined in the first title tilt. Women's basketball joined the state championships in 1981 when the championships were renewed for both boys and girls.

In its short history, the Girls' CIF/Reebok State Basketball Championships have experienced tremendous success with names like national record-holder Cheryl Miller, Lisa Leslie, Tanda Rucker and Kate Paye playing starring roles. Point Loma's four state championships (1984 Division II; 1985-87 Division I) have also highlighted girl's competition. Menlo School of Atherton, won three straight titles in Division V (1989-91).

On the boys' side, Stockton High don and nated early play winning four championships in the 1920's (1922-23, 1925, 1928).

Crenshaw High equalled that dominance in the modern championship, winning four titles in the 1980's (1983, 1985-86, 1989). Besides Murray, great names like Michael Manning, Jason Kidd, Shon Tarver, Ed O'Bannon and Stais Boseman have participated in the state finals.

The CIF/Reebok Basketball Championships have come a long way since its beginning at Whittier High in 1916. The 1990 championships marked the first time that all five boys' and girls' Divisions (I, II, III, IV and V) were housed under the same roof - the Oakland Coliseum. Attendance for the twoday championships have eclipsed the 20,000 mark in each of the last three seasons with a record 22,613 at the Arco Arena for the 1992 title games.

The CIF/Reebok State Wrestling Championships were established in 1973 and conducted at Cal State Hayward. The University of Pacific's Spanos Center has been the host site since 1987. Clovis High dominated during the first years of the championships, winning three consecutive CIF/Ree bok State Wrestling Championships frc 1974-76 and then equalled that with a current three straight 1990-92. Clovis West has won three titles (1983-84, 1989) in the

1980's.

Individually, standouts like Jimmy Aguirre, Tony Okada, Zach Cooper and Trent Barnes have competed in championships.

With the largest participation of any girls' sport, volleyball has increased its following by leaps and bounds since the first CIF/Reebok State Volleyball Championships in 1978. Highland High, Bakersfield won the first championship, held at Highland High.

In 1981, a Division II classification was added to the championships and a year later a Division III classification was included.

The CIF/Reebok State Volleyball Championships expanded to a five division format in 1991 and the result was more spectacular action under one roof.

The growth of the sport is also evident in terms of revenue. Volleyball has been a selfsupporting championship the last three seasons.

Four teams have won three titles in their respective divisions, starting with Mira Costa, which went unbeaten en route to Division I championships in both 1985 and 1990. Rim of the World has three titles in Division II, along with La Habra (1989-91). Francis Parker, San Diego has won three titles in Division III.

Individual standouts include 1991 tournament sensation and MVP Jaimie Torromeo of St. Joseph Lakewood, 1990 MVP Tracy Schriber of Corona del Mar, 1989 MVP Piper Hahn of Mira Costa, Bev Oden, Katy Eldrige, Zrinka Kristich, Kristal Atwood and Jenny Evans, among others.

Traditionally, the last CIF/Reebok Regional Championship completed during the course of the school year, the State Golf Championships were established in 1976 for boys and 1977 for girls and ran until 1981. Since then, regional championships have been conducted. Torrey Pines has dominated in the Southern Regionals with four regional championships, while Vintage of Napa has taken three Northern Regional titles. Sharon Barrett, Kim Saiki, Jean Zedlitz and Kim Cathrein have excelled on the girls side, while stars on the boys field include Craig Sadler, Joe Rassett, and David Games.

The CIF/Reebok Cross Country Championships were the newest edition to the state championship fold in 1987 and have been held annually at Woodward Park, Fresno. Bryan Dameworth and Deena Drossin, both of Agoura High, have won three and two individual state titles respectively. Jeff Wilson of Newbury Park (1990-91) and Kira Jorgensen of Rancho Buena Vista won two consecutive individual state championships (1987-88). Milena Glusac of Fallbrook broke the Girls Division I record in 1991 with a time of 17:13.

Palos Verdes girls' have dominated the team championship with three consecutive titles (1987-89). Palos Verdes High was closed in 1989 and was combined with Miraleste and Rolling Hills High into Peninsula High.

Nine teams have won two CIF/Reebok State Championships including Agoura (Girls Division I), San Pasqual (Girls Division II), Bret Harte (Girls Division III), Maranatha (Girls Division III), Nordhoff Ojai (Girls Division IV), Hart (Boys Division I), Corona del Mar (Boys Division II), San Marino (Boys Division II) and Laguna Beach (Boys Division III).

A fourth division was added to cross country in 1990.

California Prep Harriers Gather For Sixth Annual CIF/Reebok State Cross Country Championships

A fine crop of California High School cross country athletes will once again be making the trip to Fresno for this weekend's sixth annual CIF/Reebok State Cross Country Championships. The quality of participation is once again very high, with last year's Division I championship teams, Hart/SS (Boys) and Agoura/SS (Girls), crowned mythical "national champions" at season's end by Harrier Magazine. Those same very strong teams started out the 1992 season ranked in the top position nationally, with both suffering defeats during the season by other California teams, so it has been an exciting Fall. Individual quality will match the great team competition in our four Boys and Girls divisions this morning. Ryan Wilson (Agoura-Div. II)/SS, Margarito Casillas (Hoover, Glendale-Div. I)SS, and Nazario Romero (San Pasqual, Escondido)/SD were recently named among the top twenty prep male runners nationwide, with Milena Glusac (Fallbrook-Div. I)SD, Amy Skieresz (Agoura-Div. I)SS, and defending Division IV champion, Maribella Aparicio (Fillmore)/SS, accorded the same honor on the female side.

Our first race of the morning, a very competitive Boys Division IV contest, will feature a great group of four squads. McFarland/C, ranked #1 all season long at this level, has ridden the veteran trio of Jose Sanchez, Gabriel Diaz and Victor Heredia into the slight favorite's role, with two wins during the season over the best in the South. Yreka/N, led by very talented overall section champion as a frosh, Aaron Gillen, and Jeremy Ravenscroft, has performed at a very high level all Fall. Defending champion Nordhoff (Ojai)/SS is moving towards its usual torrid peak, with soph Javier Ramirez, Micah Robles, and Brock Essick, strong team leaders. Morro Bay/ SS is another very strong squad, with fine soph Dave Mitchell taking the Section title and junior Joey Taverner close behind in second.

Fillmore/SS, Taft/C, led by John Orosco, Maranatha (Sierra Madre)/SS, Fortuna/NC, and Arcata/NC are other very capable teams.

Bell Jeff (Burbank)/SS twins Jose and Leonard Diaz, Steve Brown (Piedmont)/NC, and Josh Cox (Christian, San Diego)/SD are individual threats.

The Girls Div. I contest will feature two teams performing magnificently for schools of their size, with wise coaches orchestrating their talented crews. Lassen (Susanville)/N, under veteran Coach Bob Wall, has stars Stephi Gluntini and Sally Pyle leading, with the squad's five scorers gapping at a minute and a half in the Section meet. Nordhoff(Ojai)/SS, defending champs here also under Coach Reeves (they swept both Div. IV titles last Fall), has German foreign exchange student Karen Bockel capable of well under 19:00, with Monica Berlin and the rest of the team peaking nicely. Pick the uniforms out that these two fine squads are wearing before the race starts this morning and sit back and watch a classic struggle.

Ursuline (Santa Rosa)/NC and Arcata/NC, the surprises of the 1992 CIF/Reebok State meet, finished closely in that order at the CIF /Reebok North Coast Section finals, with Dixon/SJ putting together a fine race in the Section finals. Laguna Beach/SS, Maranatha (Sierra Madre)/SS, McFarland/C, Yreka/N, and Bear River/SJ have showed the talent to challenge for the third place team award.


Defending individual champion Maribella Aparicio (Fillmore)/ SS is one of the nation's best, with Faye Roundy (Morro Bay)/SS, and Amber Parkinson (Orange Lutheran)/SS quality veterans here. In her Section finals, Anakai Webb (Bear River, Grass Valley)/SJ, showed up last at the start, fell down after 100 yards, then won by almost two minutes. Laura Hamady (Urban School, San Francisco)/ NC, small schools champ back in 1989 as a frosh, returned to the harrier wars this fall, taking the CIF/Reebok North Coast title over Vicky Fleschner (Fortuna)/NC. Marissa Hurwitz (Bishops, San Diego)/SD and Danielle Wall (Carmel)/CC were impressive in their Section finals.

The Boys Division III race features season long top-ranked Newport Harbor (Newport Beach)/SS, led by fine individuals, Jared Overton and Sky Peterka, against a talented group from around the state. St. Augustine (San Diego)/SD has Mark Hauser and Daniel O'Conner leading a very successful squad, with San Marino/SS closing to within eight points of Newport at the Section meet, with Warren Wolf, Ben Nichols, and Lee Zuckerman talented leaders for Coach Phil Ryan's team. Livermore/NC is another with great tradition, with Aaron Daniel leading the 1992 Cowboy powerhouse.

Ayala (Chino)/SS, La Puente/SS, Lemoore/C, and Los Gatos/CC are others with the talent to challenge the above foursome on a good day.

Roger Ciano (San Luis Obispo)/SS, Marcus Ferrara (South Torrance)/SS, talented soph, Jason Balkman (Lynbrook, San J CC, Joe Sauerissig(Yosemite, Oakhurst)C, and soph Darren Hc (Sonora)SJ, are other individuals who will be in the front pack.

The Girls Division III run is another with talented teams from the width and breadth of the state. Corona del Mar (Newport Harbor)/

SS has had a super fall, with the Sea Queens ranked #11 nationally. Coach Bill Sumner's crew has Tracy Clark, Dresden Howell, and Brook Meek leading a group undefeated at their level. Laguna Hills/ SS was strong in the Section meet, with Mayra Medina and Heather McGlone capable of high placings here. Miesha Marzel, undefeated this Fall and CIF/Reebok State 800-meter champion in track (2:09.84), a very strong Bishop O'Dowd (Oakland)/NC team. Aptos, if h, has the talent to challenge anyone, with Liz Leigh-Wood leading the Mariners.

St. Francis (Mountain View)/CC has one of the state's most improved athletes in Tilla Torrens out in front, with El Modena (Orange)/SS star Kristina Dahlberg, and defending champion, Newport Harbor (Newport Beach)/SS, another strong team. Carondolet (Concord)/NC was impressive in its Section Finals Meet.

Magi Martinez (Wood, Vacaville)SJ, Danielle Pekar (Rubidoux, Riverside)/SS, and Ann Baldelli (St. Ignatius, San Francisco)/CC are other talented individuals.

A very strong group of teams headlines the Boys Division II contest, with Mission Bay (San Diego)/SD currently ranked #11 nationwide and Katella (Anaheim)/SS #16 in the entire country. For Mission Bay, Devin Elizondo leads a very talented group, with Katella the strong one-two punch of Mike Love and Mike Moreno. Agoura/SS, has 1992 division runner-up Ryan Wilson, who is undefeated this Fall, and talented soph, John Greene, with the team within two points of Katella in Section Finals action. Jesuit (Sacramento)/SJ, with Matt Farley leading, has put together a super Fall, and is a legitimate title threat.

Canyon (Canyon Country)/SS, Camarillo/SS, and San Pasqual (Escondido)/SD led by top twenty rated nationally, Nazario Romero, are solid teams from down south, with Montgomery (Santa Rosa)/ NC impressive up north.


Richard Brewer (North, Bakersfield)/C, George Rivera (Delano)/ .C, Mike Pendergraph (Norte Vista, Riverside)/SS, Walter Christensen (Claremont)/SS, and Matt Creason (Eureka) have put to 7ther fine fall seasons.

Girls Division II it is kind of a "city" affair, with Huntington Beach competing with strong Edison/SS and Ocean View/SS teams, with Edison currently ranked #6 nationally. Ocean View was right with their local rival in Section finals action. Defending CIF/Reebok State champion Edison returns six of seven from that team, with new varsity team member, soph Elyse Homberger, the squad's #1 runner in her first year in the sport. Ocean View leads with the talented duo of soph Taryn Lawson and Christie Engesser, one of the nation's top 800-meter runners in track at 2:11.23, with the battle between these two special groups here a contest worth watching.

Los Gatos/CC, led by talented sophs Miranda Middlecoff and Holly Malander, Corona/SS, with fine junior Claris Fernandez leading, and Bishop Amat (La Puente)/SS, with a solid pack, should battle for the third team award. San Pasqual (Escondido)/SD, with talented Melissa Keim leading, has great tradition.

Kim Nelson (Canyon, Anaheim)/SS, Jenny Mortensen (Redwood, Visalia)/C a transfer from Idaho, and Michele Cox (Escondido)C are strong individuals.

The Boys Division I contest here each year usually settles the mythical "national title," such is the power of Golden State teams. Defending champion and crowned 1991's mythical "national champion" by Harrier Magazine, Hart (Newhall)/SS, returns most of its varsity, and has had a fine season. Thousand Oaks/SS (#7 ranked in the nation), has twice defeated Hart, with a very impressive late October Mt. SAC Invitational win and CIF/Reebok Southern Section finals run. Super sophs Jeff Fischer and Kevin Marsden led the Lancers in the Section championship win. Defending champion Hart/SS has athletes with talent to get the job done, and a big run here would be a nice "going away" present for Coach Gene Blankenship, who announced his resignation recently with a planned move to the state of Washington. Peninsula (Rolling Hills)/SS has

talented Dan Minami leading a very strong squad, with De La Salle (Concord)/NC, talented defending Division II titlests, braving a move up to the Large School level, with Mike Prindiville the top Spartan.

Margarito Casillas (Hoover, Glendale)/SS, last year's individual runner-up at this level, returns undefeated thus far this Fall. Jaime Martinez (Orange)/SS, talented junior Eric Dunn (Arroyo Grande)/ SS, and Jim Cera (Upland)/SS have all had fine Fall seasons. Mehbrahton Keflezhighi (San Diego)/SD, an Etrian native, has been super this season. Scott Carvelli (Santa Teresa, San Jose)/CC and Brian Wilkinson (Merced)/SJ, the nation's top middle distance runner in track where he has run 1:51.19 for 800 meters and 4:11.17 for 1600 meters, were Section individual champs.

Our Girls Division I championship race features another #1 nationally ranked squad out to continue to reprove itself. Agoura/ SS, which amazingly has never been worse than second in this meet since its inception (talk about tradition), ended the 1991 season as the nation's #1 ranked squad by Harrier magazine. Injuries and illness held the Chargers down durning mid-season, with a solid win over current #2 ranked nationally Peninsula (Rolling Hills)/SS in the Section finals. Peninsula is not shabby in the tradition department either, with Coach Joe Kelly taking three CIF/Reebok State titles while at Palos Verdes High before the district combined into one campus at Peninsula, where they were second in 1991. Mt. Carmel/SD hopes to hold off the rest of the CIF Southern Section contingent with Melanie Pickett and Jennifer Vergith top Sundevil runners. Irvine/SS, with strong Kelly Roda leading, had a fine Section finals race, with Wilson (Long Beach)/SS, 1990 third placer Erica Sumi and Christine Lewis, another squad capable of a team time will under 100:00 here. Belmont (L.A.)/LA has Patty Trejo leading a team that had 19 points in the Section meet.

The individual battle in this event will be very special. Milena Glusac (Fallbrook)/SD, the defending Div. I champ, broke one of the nation's most respected course records at Mt. SAC earlier in the year under less than ideal muddy conditions. Amy Skieresz (Agoura)/SS was a distant second in that race, but closed timewise to within ten seconds of Glusac's record in setting a Mt. SAC soph course record in the CIF/Reebok Southern Section finals. The duo rates among the top half dozen runners in the nation, with Glusac having broken the spirits of many a challenger in recent years with her wicked early pacing. The individual contest out front will be an interesting one. Grace Durnell (Merced)/SJ has romped to impressive invitational wins statewide.



Fallbrook's Glusac At the Head Of the 1992 Class; Could Challenge 17-Minute Barrier

One might wonder what mountains are left for Fallbrook's Milena Glusac to climb.

Glusac, the defending Division I CIF/Reebok State Cross Country Champion. Glusac, the 1992 CIF/Reebok State 3,200meter champion. Glusac, who has covered Woodward Park's 3.1-mile course faster than anyone during a state championship. Glusac, who in four years has never lost to another runner from her section.

How about the 17-minute barrier?

In running away with the CIF/Reebok State Cross Country title last fall, Glusac clocked a wining time of 17:13. That broke by 14 seconds the course record set by Agoura's Deena Drossin in 1989.

Simple math says if Glusac can break her own course record by 14 seconds, she will eclipse the magical barrier.

"I think she has a shot at it," says her coach, Marty Hauck. It just depends how she feels on any given day. Maybe it's how her biorhythms fall that day.

"Because of the way the season has gone, she is peaking later this year. Week by week she's getting stronger.

"For example, she played two hours of hard tennis (finishing second in the tough Palomar League finals), rested a little, then came back later in the day and won the Palomar League cross country finals. Her time, despite running in the heat of the day, was close to her PR for that course."

And what does Glusac think?

"The important thing is winning the races at the end of the year, she said after racing to victory by almost a minute in the Mt. Carmel Invitational. "I want to be running my best at the end of the season; the times you run early in the year aren't important."

Especially when you're the school's No. 1 girls tennis player in addition to running every opponent into the ground while maintaining a 4.10 grade point average.

The Milena Glusac you see today is a different one from a year ago. Oh, she is still unbeaten going into the Division I championships. She still jumps right into the lead, a la Mary Decker Slaney. And she still gets the most out of her 92 pounds.

But the Glusac who ran last year had set records in almost every major meet. This year she set just one, the big one, Cipsing the Mt. SAC course record by running 17:13 in Suppery, muddy conditions that experts say should have cost her 15 to 20 seconds.

The Glusac that ran last year was not the experienced runner she is this time around, since she just started running as a freshman in 1988. Glusac's title in 1991 was her first major victory at the state level. She would follow that with her first CIF/Reebok State 3,200-meter title in the spring and a few weeks later, add the National Junior 3,000-meter crown.

Somewhere between winning that 3,000 and running against the Canadians a month later, she suffered a stomach ailment. She could train, but come race time, she would start feeling stomach pains midway through the race.

Although her times did not approach last year, she won this fall anyway. Finally, her problem was properly diagnosed and within weeks, the old Milena was back, just in time for Mt. SAC.

That is significant only because Glusac would suffer the lone disappointment in her running career just two weeks after last year's CIF/Reebok State meet.

After winning the Kinney Western Regional in 17:11 (cutting two seconds off her time at the state meet but still shy of Drossin's 17:08.78 record in the 1990 Kinney regionals), Glusac went to the Kinney nationals in San Diego as one of the favorites and the overwhelming hometown choice.

She was in a pack of three leaders through the first half of the race. Then she started slipping back, farther and farther, until by the finish she was 30th out of 32.

Rushed to the medical tent after collapsing at the finish line, it was determined the weeks and weeks of hard running had depleted her glycogen supply. Halfway throught the Kinney Nationals, she ran out of glycogen. Doctors said while not lifethreatening, it was amazing she was able to finish the race at all.

Having pushed herself less this year, Hauck says Glusac is ready to attack the "Big Three" races, starting today.

"Milena ran 17:17 at Mt. SAC on a 90-degree day (in 1991) and ran 17:13 on a cold day (1992), so nothing fazes her," said Hauck. "She always knows where to divide this course into segments mentally, which is important when you run from the front like she does.

"On a big day, I believe she could take a run at 17-minutes." What about opponents?


Hauck says the way she handled the Mt. SAC field this year and the CIF/Reebok State field last time, Glusac will probably be running more against the clock than any individual.

One opponent expressed the thoughts of those who run against Glusac.

"With Milena Glusac you know she's going to take it out fast, faster than you want to run," said Claremont High's Laura Monson after finishing second to Glusac in the Southern California Invitational.

"You run your race and hope that for some reason she slows down and you can catch her the second half of the race. Realistically, that won'thappen. If she's healthy, she's unbeatable."

Monson is one of the lucky ones. She will run in Division II.



afraid to go to state. In fact, we look forward to it every year, but I'm not sure we have the horses to run with McFarland," noted coach Jim Eckman, who teaches government at Yreka High as well.

Jeremy Ravenscroft, second at the sectional meet (seven conds behind Gillen), "gives us a really strong 1-2 punch," man added.

"Frankly, our number three runner (Jason Allen) - at least on paper - was our top returning runner from last year's state meet."

The girls team is keeping pace with the boys. In placing second in their sectional meet, the Lady Miners will be making their third straight run in the CIF/Reebok State Championships.

Fourth in the state a year ago, Yreka has been in-and-out of the top 10 this season. Leading the way for the Lady Miners isjunior Traci Anderson. She's also making her third straight appearance at Woodward Park.

"A two-time qualifier to the California State track meet in the 200 and 400, Traci is really more of a sprinter. But she's such an outstanding talent that she has the ability to run long distances," said Eckman. "Right behind her is junior Jamie Herbst. In fact, she beat Traci at the Northern Section meet."

Going into the 1992 season, Eckman, a former mayor of Yreka and currently serving on the city council, said that he had high hopes for the girls being a contender for the CIF/Reebok State title.

"But one of our absolute top girls moved to Portland," said Eckman. "When you're a small school (750 students) you don't get that many bodies out. Consequently, losing one person like that can kill you. We just don't have the depth that the schools can draw from.

Success breeds success," he said, "and we've really been on a roll."

If he could pinpoint a beginning, he would go back in time to 1982 when a Miner by the name of Jim Frey was burning up the cross country courses, although he made a name for himself in the state track and field annals (winning the mile in 1983 at 4:08.82).

"Jim, who won the NorCal state meet, was sort of the trigger. Along with another young man, Jeff Franklin. They put us on the map. Distance running has been a real popular thing up here ever since," noted Eckman.

"The kids take a great deal of pride in the program. Highly thought of in Yreka, cross country is not a stepchild to any of the other sports. The community support is enormous. Practically every parent, who has a kid running, is in attendance at our dual meets.

"Also, we have a low-key, but extremely successful elementary program. They train the kids only three days a week, but we're getting enough kids out of the program to keep the interest and success going at the high school."

Road trips and the ability to have just about any environment to train in helps too.

"Since we are the last town in California on Interstate 5, my closest competition is in the state of Oregon," said Eckman. A member of the Northern Athletic League, Yreka's closest Appetition is 100 miles away (three Redding schools). In fact, Eckman said that he has two athletes who live 53 miles apart.

"So we are primarily competing against the top schools in Oregon. Southern Oregon is more or less a hotbed for cross country in the state of Oregon, which is known as a running

state.

"That really benefits us greatly," he said. "Thirty miles from us is the community of Ashland. They had an invitational this year where we ran against the number one, three and fourth-ranked teams in Oregon. We get our brains pretty battered when we go up there, but when you're running against the caliber of those teams it really hardens you. To a degree, I believe that's the real key to our success."

Eckman said that the Yreka cross country program has six kids running at the collegiate level.

"Our school district is physically one of the largest in the state," explained Eckman. "We bus about 50 percent of our kids in. With our natural surroundings (canyons and mountains), we have excellent training facilities."

Eckman, who got his masters at UCLA, is in his 22nd year at Yreka High. Both he and his wife are from the Midwest and the small town of Yreka seemed a perfect fit for them.

"My wife and I tend to be rather political, and so we've been very involved politically here in the community and service organizations," said Eckman, who served on the city council from 1974-1982. He was mayor of Yreka for four years.

When elected mayor, Eckman was the youngest mayor ever elected in Yreka. The highlight of his political involvement occurred six years ago.

"We ran a campaign for a gentleman, by the name of Charlie Bird, and Charlie was then and still is today the first and only black elected sheriff in the history of the state of California. And, he's kind of a real legend up here in Northern California...Those are the things you have an opportunity to get involved with in a small town if you want to make a difference in people's lives," added Eckman.

"As a government teacher, it has really been extra rewarding to be able to practice what I preach," he said.

Eckman said his kids love running on the Woodward Park course.

"I do clinics and people are always asking why we're so successful. In one five-year stretch, we had a state mile champion, a pole vaulter finish fourth, and two or three discus throwers. How is a small town able to pull this off? My answer is: We're not afraid to travel and find competition. We always come down and run the state course (Clovis Invitational) in September."

Thus, the amount of community support Yreka High receives enables the Miners to travel the road of success.

Gordon Weisenburger Belmont High CIF LA City Section

Weisenburger has been coaching for 38 years, 17 of which have been in the sport of cross country. During that time, his boys' varsity team has a 106-10 dual meet record, while his girls' team is 79-17. Counting his junior varsity programs, Weisenburger's teams have won 29 CIF/Reebok LA City Section Championships. Weisenburger is the LA Coaches Association cross country representative. He was selected as the American Athletics Cross Country Coach of the Year for the CIF LA City Section in 1991 and was selected as Outstanding Educator for the LA Unit C.A.P.H.E.R in 1990.


Andy Leong Lowell High CIF San Francisco Section


Marc Christensen McAteer High CIF San Francisco Section

Gene Blankenship Hart High CIF Southern Section




Gary Adams McFarland High CIF Central Section


Tony O'Geen Bret Harte High CIF Sac-Joaquin Section


Dennis McClanahan Mt. Carmel High CIF San Diego Section




Linda Doniak Central Valley High CIF Northern Section




