# HALF CENTURY ANNIVERSARY MT. SAN ANTONIO CROSS-COUNTRY INVITATIONAL A HISTORY and A PHILOSOPHY 

In 1948, Mt. San Antonio College initiated the first major Cross Country Invitational Meet in Southern California with the philosophy of extending competition to as many young distance runners as possible. Today, we are celebrating our Fiftieth of cross country competition over the hills of Mt. San Antonio College.

In its first running, the meet attracted ten (10) high schools and nine (9) community colleges with a total of 148 runners competing in two (2) prep divisions (Open and Novice) and one Varsity Junior College race. The course was located in what is now the West Campus area and included the western farm area of the present campus. The late Hilmer Lodge founded the event and served as its director until his retirement in 1962. In 1963, Don Ruh took over the directorship with Bud Peterson of Ganesha High School serving as the high school coordinator it was in 1964 that grade level competition and "Team Times" were first introduced to cross country scoring. It was also at this time that the finish of the Mt. SAC course was moved off the track \& the course made more "Spectator Friendly" while more challenging to the athlete. Dave Casper of Baldwin Park High School and Jim Polite of Walnut High School have since coordinated and sponsored the high school divisions.

Over the years, the meet has grown to become the most comperitive cross country meet in the Nation. With the increased popularity of distance running in Southern California, combined with the basic philosophy of the Mt. SAC INVITATIONAL, new divisions have been established to grant equal, but yet very competitive, competition to a wide range of athletic abilities and talents.

Friday afternoon, October 16, over a thousand youth representing nearly 50 Junior High School will take to the 2.0 mile course in the single most important meet of their competitive season. This Division has grown in popularity each year since its humble beginnings back in 1969. That event will be followed by an ever-growing elementary school division competition at 4:45 p.m. Runners in grades 5-6 and 3-4 were first included in 1989, and last year youths from over 30 schools competed.

On the morning of October 16 , approximately seventeen community colleges will compete in the invitational Varsity Division races. A men's and women's 5 -mile Paarlauf Relay has also been established to provide competition for off-season track athletes. The Paarlauf is a European innovation encouraged by guest lecturer and national coach of England, Geoffrey Dyson at a Mt. SAC Clinic in 1970.

The Friday and Saturday, October 23-24, high school competition will necessitate the running of over 80 separate races with divisions for Varsity athletes, Junior Varsity, Sophomores, and Freshmen. Over 400 high schools will enter the 51st Annual Mt. SAC INVITATIONAL with athletes numbering over 11,000. Each race will be considered a "final," in that races include approximately 20 schools and are traditionally seeded by geography, size, and strength. In $1967, \mathrm{Mt}$. SAC was the first to initiate a system of determining overall success by comparing team times throughout the entire day of competition. A sweepstakes championship was given to that team of five runners which earned the fastest mark in each of the three divisions. The system of "best times" has grown in popularity in cross country ever since its start at Mt. SAC in 1967. In 1993 five divisional structures of C.I.F. classification (I, II, III, IV, V) were used to determine even more equitable competition.

Of equal popularity is the Mt. SAC Cross Country Souvenir T-Shirt, first printed in 1965 and in more recent years uniquely designed by a young cartoonist, Mark Gutierrez, who himself ran cross country at Walnut High School and Mt. SAC. Souvenir Pins were also introduced for the first time in 1968 and have since become a valuable collectors item.

Traditional plaque and medal awards are given in each of over 95 races that guarantee pride in achievement. Plentiful as they are, a fraternal respect exists among all recipients as each knows the training required to achieve success on the rugged hills of the Mt. San Antonio College Cross Country Course. Today, fathers and mothers and even grandfathers can share with their off springs, the experiences of running the hills of the Mt. SAC Cross Country Invitational changed little over all these many years.

On our 40th anniversary, the first inductees into the new Mt. SAC Cross Country Hall of Fame were honored. A special bar-b-que recognizing those whose dedication and inspiration had made them worthy of this very special honor was held. (Please see "Hall of Fame" article in your program.) Inductions have been made in subsequent years.

We welcome all to our Fifty-First Annual Mt. San Antonio Cross Country Invitational and trust the experiences encountered will be of great value to all involved. We congratulate every athlete and coach for the work and effort that has been exerted just to reach this point in competition. Have pride in the fact that you have done your best, as this is really the great lesson to be learned from athletics!

## HONORARY REFEREE BILLY MILLS

We are proud to honor one of America's greatest athletes as our Honorary Referee for our 51st Annual Mt. Sac Cross Country Invitational. It is particularly significant that our nation's largest and most prestigious gathering of cross country athletes will have the individual whose life story most exemplifies the spirit of athletes among America's youth.

His story has been told on the screen with the performances of Robby Benson, Graham Greene, and Pat Hingle in the inspiring Award Winning Movie "RUNNING BRAVE". One of the greatest true life athletes motion picture ever produced, tells the uplifting story of a young athlete who chooses cross country and track to achieve successes he really never dreamed possible as a boy.

His story tells of the hardships he faced as an American Indian, as a student and athlete, and as a young man. It tells the story of training and competition from his early running days through the day in Tokyo (October 14,1964 - Almost 34 years to the day) that $\mathrm{Bi}^{1-}$ Mills upset the world record holder to win the 1964 Olympic Gold Medal in the $10,000 \mathrm{~m}$ run. It has often been described as one of the greatest of all American Olympic victories, and if seeing it, we think you would agree.

Billy Mills is a graduate of the University of Kansas ('62), Captain in the U.S. Marine Corps (62-65), World Record holder in the 6 Mile Run (' 65 ) \& set 7 American track $\&$ field records ('65). He has since been given 3 Honorary Doctorate degrees, been inducted into 5 Halls of Fame, including the U.S. Olympic and World Sports Humanitarian Halls of Fame. His awards for service and contributions to fitness and sport are too numerous to mention here, but those he is most proud of are those associated with his work helping today's Indian youth and adults identify and pursue their dream.

Billy Mills will be with us on Friday and Saturday October 23rd and 24th.

This great American hero has run at Mt. San Antonio College before (1964 Olympic Trials at Mt. Sac), but has never seen the Mt. Sac Cross Country Invitational. He can't imagine a cross country meet of this size, so please (as our guest) make him feel at home. We welcome you, Billy Mills. We are honored to have you share in our 51 st annual event.

## SCORING SYSTEM FOR COMMUNITY COLLEGES

In a continuing effort to promote Cross Country at the community college level, a new Team Championship Title was established at the MT. SAC CROSS COUNTRY INVITATION in 1988.

To encourage "Total Programs" (men and Women), the MT. SAC INVITATIONAL established as its highest honor the "Team Champion Award" based on the combined best "team times" of both the men's and women's results.

## Overall Awards Are As Follows:

Novice: Individual awards for those runners who do not qualify as the top seven (Varsity). This novice competition is intended not only to encourage younger athletes but also to emphasize the importance of team depth.

Varsity Division: Men's and Women's varsity competition with teams divided into three (3) smaller, more competitive division races based on the size of school and enrollment (Large Men, Small Men, and a Womens, and race). Varsity men's teams are limited to seven (7) runners, while women's teams are unlimited in numbers.

Invitational
Women's Division:
Based on a strong record or a wish to compete against the strongest of all colleges, a women's Invitational Race will be run. This women's race will not be restricted to only seven (7) runners.

Invitational
Men's Division:
If a team's record proves itself especially strong or a team wishes to run in a race of strong teams, they will compete in the Invitational Division. Only seven (7) runners may represent a team with only five (5) scoring.

Overall Team
Championship:
From all Varsity and Invitational Divisions, an overall women's and men's championship is determined (based on team times). From the combined overall results of both the men's and women's races the actual overall Team Champion will be selected (combined team times of men's \& women's teams).

## PREVIOUS COMMUNITY COLLEGE CHAMPIONS A HISTORY

In 1964, team champions were first determined by a system of "team times" (combined times of a team's first five [5] runners).

In 1978, Women's Cross Country developed to the extent that this same system could be used to determine "A Champion" from among all the larger and smaller colleges (as with the men).

In 1988, an "Overall Team Sweepstakes Championship" was structured to recognize those colleges having the best combined men's and women's team (as based on their combined team times).

Consider the free program offered by the Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angeles in conjunction with the Mt. San Antonio College Relays (Mt. Sac Relays). It's a great program aimed at getting your area elementary and middle schools involved in a track and field program by introducing the sport to the entire student body and demonstrating the fun and opportunities available to them in the sport. As follow up, the Mt. Sac Relays offers all the youth (grades 3-8), two special days of fun competition at the Mt. Sac Relays. April 10th is the day for boys and girls in Elementary Schools grades 3-6, April 16th for those in Middle Schools Grades 6-8.

Since 1986, over 131,000 youth from hundreds of Southern California Elementary and Middle Schools have taken part in the annual program with nothing but positive results.

It's been very encouraging seeing so many elementary and middle schools develop track and field programs and organize school teams, in a large part, due to the AAF-Mt. Sac Relays Instructional Program and Youth Days. Last year alone over 11,000 youth and their teachers were part of the Instructional Clinic Program, with another 4,900 youth participating in Youth Days. Most encouraging is the fact $99 \%$ of all the Youth Days participants were entered by Teachers, Coaches, and Administrators from Elementary, Middle, and Jr. High Schools. Many were having their first-ever experience as athletes and coaches, but none had problems in that their interest and enthusiasm alone made their experiences nothing less than spectacular. School pride, self satisfaction, and lots of fun were the most obvious of all the rewards. The medals, ribbons, certificates, $\mathbf{t}$-shirts, pins, and other more tangible rewards were nothing more than "icing on the cake" when all looked back on their Youth Day experiences.

It's a great introduction to the sport that has so many opportunities for so many youth. It's a great introduction to the world's most important and prestigious Olympic sport - track and field (athletics). It's a great opportunity for all elementary and middle schools to organize, revitalize, and promote what should be an important part of their physical education program in their school. It's a great opportunity for the high school coach to promote the sport at their "feeder school". Bob Larsen: Succesful coach at Monte Vista High School in the 1960's, then developed Mt. SAC Invitational and long list of State championship teams at Grossmont College in the '70's. Presently coaching at U.C.L.A.

Jeff Nelson: As a student at Burbank High School, he ran the fastest time ever at the Invitational (14:32) in 1978. His record remained upon his 1988 installation.
Tracy Smith: Arcadia High School stand-out who held the old Mt. SAC course record for three years in the 1960's. His career extended for over 20 years thereafter.
John Ward: Santa Ana College coach with numerous Mt. SAC Invitational (3), conference (8), and state (3) championships. A legend in his day in both cross country and track and field coaching.

1. This meet is not the "World Championships"! Your athletes are running only for "fun" and "experience"!
2. None of your athletes should compete today if you feel you might be jeopardizing their health or well being. Do not gamble with those who have not been or are not now in $100 \%$ good health, those who do not respond well in heat, or those who suffer from asthma or other respiratory problems. (Do they have their proper medication, etc.)
3. Make sure all of your athlete's water intake is sufficient to prevent dehydration...before and after their race.
4. All teams with trainers: Please have your trainers check-in at the EMS/First Aid Center, upon arrival. (Southeast end of the stadium)
5. Coaches: If your athlete has been taken to the EMS Center, you must place a priority on your arrival to that center with all information, medication, etc. that might assist in your athlete's earliest recovery.
6. Any coach, athlete, and/or manager may go out on the course for medical emergency reasons....to assist ant athlete in need, get to a communications center. (The course trails are otherwise off-limits to all but athlete's in competition).
