

to the 27th edition of the Stanford Cross Country Invitational, co-hosted by Palo Alto High School.

The beautiful Stanford Golf Course will serve as the setting for 19 races for high schools, colleges, and open competitors.

At the conclusion of the day, nearly 4,000 runners will have competed at the home of the Cardinal men's and women's cross country teams.

A shady site covered with more than 300 oak trees. the course is both picturesque and challenging. Just as rich as the scenery is the tradition of top flight cross country competition.

Home of the NCAA District VIII Championships for six seasons, and the Pac-10 Championships from 1972 to 1997, the course has challenged some of the finest distance runners in the world.

In order for us to continue hosting an excellent cross country meet, your cooperation is needed in respecting the Stanford Golf Course. Please stay off the greens, the sand traps, and tees at all times, and do not disturb the horses located in the Stanford Barn.

Outstanding high school athletes from California, up and down the West Coast, and across the United States will race today over 3,000 meters for junior varsity squads, and 5,000 meters for varsity teams. In each junior varsity race, awards will be presented to the top two teams and top ten individuals. The top four teams and 15 individuals in the varsity races will receive awards. Additionally, each of the seven members of the winning varsity teams will receive a special award recognizing their team's victory.

In the late afternoon, some of the nation's finest collegiate runners will tackle the challenging course. Stanford, the 1996 and 1997 NCAA men's champions, and the Cardinal women's team, which has finished in the top three for the past three seasons, welcomes schools representing each NCAA Division as well as a selection of NAIA, junior and community programs. After the men's 8,000 meter University Championship Invitational, a special non-team race will be held to enable a selection of open athletes to compete.

On behalf of the programs at Stanford University and Palo Alto High School, we hope you enjoy your afternoon of cross country.






Collegiate Preview

Several of the nation's men's and women's cross country teams will compete today at the 27th annual Stanford

The women's competition will be blessed with six of the nation's Top-25 teams in the pre-season national polls. The list includes #1 ranked Stanford, #2 Wisconsin, #4 Kansas State, #7 Arkansas, #16 and Pac-10 rival Washington, and #25 UC Irvine. Last year, the Arkansas Razorbacks finished second at the NCAA championships, behind national champion Brigham Young, and just ahead of third place Stanford. Erica Palmer won the NCAA individual title for Wisconsin, and last year at the Stanford Invitational, she ran a 16:48 over 5,000 meters to finish in fifth place. Amy Yoder, competing for Arkansas, won the individual crown with a time of 16:41.

Palmer will be a runner to watch at today's meet. The sophomore not only won the NCAA cross country title last year, but also excelled in track where she earned All-America honors with a second place finish in the NCAA indoor 5,000 meters and sixth place in the 3,000 meters. She won the Big Ten title in the 10,000 meters.

Kansas State finished fifth at the NCAA's last year, its best finish in school history. Look for top performances from Korene Hinds and Amy Mortimer. Both were NCAA cross country All-Americans last year. Hinds placed tenth at the NCAA's, and Mortimer recently won the individual title at the Wichita State Gold Classic.

Lillie Kleinmann is one of the top runners for the Arkansas Razorbacks. Last year, Kleinmann finished third at the NCAA's to gain All-America honors, and eighth at the Stanford Invitational.

Last year at the Stanford Invitational, the Cardinal women won the team title with 36 points, compared to 51 points for Arkansas, and 82 points for BYU. Wisconsin and Kansas State rounded out the Top-5. Julia Stamps was Stanford's top finisher in second place at 16:43. Three other Stanford runners finished in the Top-10, including Lauren Fleshman in fourth place, Erin Sullivan in sixth place, and Sally Glynn in seventh place.

This year, the Cardinal is ranked #1 in the FinishLynx Pre-Season National Poll. Stanford chalked up 290 points compared to 281 for Wisconsin.

The men's competition will be strong. Stanford is ranked #2 in the pre-season. The men's competition will have a local flavor with such schools as UC Davis, Fresno State, and Sacramento State. Southern Utah and CalPoly competed at the NCAA's last year. Southern Utah upset Colorado to win the NCAA Mountain Regional Championship last year.

Last year, the Cardinal men won the team title with 37 points compared to Arizona's 46. Thomas Murley was Stanford's top runner with a second place finish. Three other Cardinal runners finished in the Top-10; Jake Maas (4th) Jesse Thomas (7th) and Jamey Gifford (9th).






