My comments on the BCL Championships:

In a classic display of pack running, we took second place in both the boys and girls varsity, despite only placing one individual in the top ten in either race. Our guys are for real!! (I can't believe you didn't even mention us in your league prognostications!). Our 1-5 spread of 32 seconds is not unusual--we had a 27 second spread in our dual meet against University on Tuesday this week. We now hope to make some noise in the postseason.

Other comments on the boys race: (1) University is tough!!! You'd best put them in the top five now or risk looking foolish later! I look for them to be right up front at the Division IV North preliminary race. (2) Branson's soccer players still haven't made an appearance. Perhaps they never will this year. I doubt they will be able to beat University even with the soccer bunch running. (3) Jason Hardy of CSD did not run--his school competed in the National Deaf Cross-Country Championships in Ohio this weekend instead. Look out for this guy in the postseason! He was only 18 seconds off the course record in our dual meet. I think he is capable of running right up there with Jon Genant in the NCS final.

Comments on the girls race: (1) Branson is going to be a serious contender for a state qualifying spot. Some of their runners did not have great races and they still swept most of the top places. (2) College Prep's #3 runner dropped out of the race halfway, and their #5 runner had a very bad race. This dropped them all the way down to fourth place overall. I don't expect them to repeat this poor performance in the postseason races--they are still a strong team.
