Quintana wins first Oakland Marathon

The boom of a cannon shattered the usual Sunday quiet in downtown Oakland, sending a mass of scantily clad humanity surging eastward from Franklin down 13th Street.

In the early dawn of a gray, over-cast morning the first Oakland Marathon, numbering over 2,000 entrants, was off and running.

Two hours, 20 minutes and 47 seconds later Ted Quintana, 24, his face contorted with pain, was the first to cross the finish line at 11th and Broadway. It was his first "serious" attempt at the 26-mile, 385-yard grind.

"I'm tired, tired! I'm glad it's over," gasped the former San Lorenzo High,

gasped the former San Lorenzo High, Chabot College and Hayward State dis-tance standout. "I just want to sleep." Forty seconds later came Lee Ed-monds, a Grass Valley 22-year-old who also qualified for the U.S. Olympic by completing the course out to the Coliseum and back, around Lake Merritt, down to Maritime St. and then up 7th to Broadway in less than 2:21.54. Third-placer Salvador Berumen of

San Jose, running his third marathon, was disappointed at failing to achieve the qualifying standard but happy his 2:22:58 was some 14 minutes under his previous best.

Sue Munday of San Jose, who "wasn't even thinking of winning" only her second marathon, was the first woman to finish. Her time of 2:47:57 was well below the under-3:20 standard

required for women to enter the Boston Marathon. The men's cutoff is 2:50. Roughly an hour and a half earlier

Mike Cassady, a Moffett Field Navy lieutenant from Miles, Iowa, found his way to the Coliseum BART Station finish after "a little confusion" and won the half-marathon in 1:06.

Former Albany High and present Cal middle distance runner Greg Bachand was second in 1:08.38.

The first female finisher of the 13.1-mile race was 13-year-old Teresa Barrios of Laguna Beach, a pert 4-foot-8, 78-pound transplanted Oregonian who outran her father and brother with a time of 1:23:53.

Quintana, who competes for the Aggie Running Club and works at Runner's Feet, was a 9:11 and 8:53 twomiler at San Lorenzo High and Hayward State, respectively. The 5-6, 114-pounder's only previous marathon was 'workout" in 2:40.

"Winning is just extra gloss," he said after pouring a glass of water over his head. "Basically, I wanted to qualify for the Olympic Trials.

"I wanted to run about 5:20 per mile, but I felt pretty good after five or six miles. The others let me get away and I was running around 5:15 to 5:16

then. "The course is very good. It's fast, the hills didn't bother me and the weather couldn't have been better.

"I felt pretty confident after 17 miles," he continued, "but at 19 I began to get chilly and dizzy. I started to lag a little and got a little scared. I thought about what happened to Kirk Pfeffer (who was overtaken by Bill Rodgers) in the New York Marathon.

"But at about 24 miles I glanced back and saw nobody, and someone said I had about a three-quarter mile lead. That's when I thought I might win,' Quintana said.

Edmonds, a former Bucknell University 10,000-meter man who now runs under the Youth for Christ banner, said he was "happy the Lord let me run as fast as I could," but admitted to a slight problem.

From 13 miles on I had to go to the bathroom. It was really touch and go.

Munday, 21, said her only previous marathon was in 1976 at Santa Monica, where she clocked

"That's a 27-minute improvement, and I really didn't know how to run a marathon," bubbled the 5-4, 110-pounder. "I had hoped to run 2:50, but I really wasn't thinking of winning. I was running mainly for experience, and to try to qualify for Boston.

"I liked the cold weather, and those little hills (overpasses) came at just the right time for me. I felt great at the finish.'

Munday's time is the fastest by a woman on a Bay Area course. The previous best was 2:49:45 by Carol Young in the San Francisco marathon last summer

Cassady opted for the halfmarathon since he had already qualified for the Olympic Trials with a 2:18:32 at the Nike run in

Eugene, Ore. He said his confusion near the end Sunday was because he did not communicate with the cyclists who were leading the way for the full marathon

Aside from overrunning the turnoff a little, Cassady's only complaint was the 7 a.m. start. "But if you want to run," he added, "you'll show up for a race at any time."

He liked the countdown of the last few seconds before the cannon went off so that "everyone got away clean," said the course was fast and well-marked and complimented the Oakland policemen for keeping it safe.

Barrios, whose time beat the first woman in the open division half by 1:03, has run two full marathons at her previous home in Seaside, Ore. She said her best time is 3:14.

David Aguileira of Sacramento went the full distance in a wheelchair, finishing in 2:48:18 despite losing about three minutes when he went off course at the halfmarathon finish. He was given a 10-minute head start at the beginning of the race.

Jay Helgerson of Foster City, whose goal is to get into the Guinness Book of Records by running a marathon each week for a year, completed No. 45. His string is unbroken since Jan. 28.

Robert Sallie of Oakland skated the entire distance. "It's hard, man," he acknowledged. "I couldn't keep up with the lead runners.

The oldest participant was Teritus Chandler, 64, who ran his first marathon at age 52. This was his 10th.
